The following telegram and answer indicates the part Chestertown, through the influence of Mrs. Wilbur W. Hubbard, may play in bringing about world-wide peace, a plea for the establishment of which was made yesterday by President Wilson.

New York City, Nov. 24th, 1915.
Mrs. WILBUR W. HUBBARD, Chestertown, Md.
For the sake of all the anxious mothers dreading that their sons may be added to the millions of men already killed or crippled in this war, will you strengthen the appeal to be made by next Friday by Ethel Snowden, of England, and Rosica Schirmer, of Hungary, by telegraphing President Wilson, at Washington, somewhat as follows: We urge a conference of neutral nations dedicated to finding a just settlement of this war.
