IN THE CHURCHES.

Christ Methodist Protestant Church, Dr. W. R. Graham, pastor. Services on Sunday, December 20th, and preaching by the pastor at 10.30 A. M. and 7.30 P. M. Advent services. Morning subject: "The Incarnation a Testimony." Evening subject: "Ante-Advent." Sabbath school 2.30 P. M. Christian Endeavor service 6.45 P. M. Mid-week service Thursday evening at 7.30 o'clock.

The Rev. Sedgwick W. Bidwell, said to be the oldest Methodist minister in the United States, died on Sunday at the age of 105 years. He had lived in East Middlebury, Vermont, since his retirement, after three-quarters of a century of service as a clergyman. He celebrated his 100th anniversary on Dec. 6, 1909, by delivering a sermon in the village church.

Rev. W. W. White will preach in Fairlee M. E. Church to-morrow morning, Dec. 20, at 10.30. Subject: "The Babe in the Manger." He will also preach at Worton in the afternoon at 3 o'clock. Subject: "The Nativity." The Sunday school of these two churches will hold their Christmas services during the incoming week, the days yet to be decided upon.

Rev. E. T. Liddell will preach to men only at Bond Church Sunday, Dec. 20th, at 2 P. M. Boys under 14 years of age not admitted. Rev. Liddell will also preach at 10.30 A. M. and 7.30 P. M. of the same day.

Special dispensation from Pope Benedict will permit the eating of turkey and other meats on Christmas Day, which this year comes on Friday. However, Christmas Eve is a day of abstinence, and Catholics are not allowed to partake of flesh meats on this day. There is no restriction on the kinds of meats permissible on Christmas Day, and no special letter of dispensation has been sent out to the various parishes in the archdiocese by Cardinal Gibbons.

Chestertown M. E. Church, Rev. Louis E. Barrett, D. D., pastor. Services next Sunday, Dec. 20th, as follows: 10.30 A. M., preaching by the pastor—subject: "The Cradle Lifting the World." The choir will render Christmas anthems. 2.15 P. M., Christmas music and exercise in the Sabbath school. 7.30 P. M., sermon by the pastor. Prayer meeting every Wednesday evening. All invited.

The revival meetings at Still Pond M. E. Church continues with marked success. There have been a number of conversions thus far, and those who have been attending the meetings profess to have been cheered and strengthened thereby. We thought Dr. Hubbard was preaching fine sermons at the very beginning, but each additional sermon reveals even greater power and eloquence. We feel sorry that any should miss hearing him. He will remain with us till the close of the meeting to-morrow (Sunday) night and preach at all the services.

Mr. Clews, having partially recovered from a severe attack of grippe, held services at the Georgetown and Kennedyville churches. A substantial offering was taken for the Belgian relief fund. Because of the severity of the weather in the evening, the service at Worton had to be given up. Next Sunday, being the Sunday before Christmas, appropriate services will be held. Special sermon and music. Mr. and Mrs. Clews will sing at Georgetown in the morning and at Worton in the evening. Service at Kennedyville at two o'clock. The pastor and family are now settled in the new manse, and find it a very cozy and delightful home; thanks to many good people. It is planned to dedicate the manse shortly and at that time a list of names and amounts given will be at the disposal of all (unless individuals request otherwise.) These names will be finally inscribed on parchment which will be framed and kept as a perpetual memorial. It may be said here that the manse is not entirely finished. The bath room is not equipped. This will doubtless be attended to soon, according to contract. And then one more thing. A fire-place heater is very desirable and necessary for the pastor's study. Indeed the study cannot be occupied until this essential piece of furniture is provided. The trustees are on the lookout for such second hand. It may be some one would like his or her name inscribed on the above mentioned parchment as having donated so much to the manse. If such a one will communicate with Rev. William Clews, the donation will be gratefully received. The date of dedication will be announced later.

At the Third Quarterly Conference of Greensboro M. E. Church held Dec. 9th. Rev. A. P. Prettyman, the pastor, was most cordially invited to return for another year. The following very complimentary resolution was unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, The pastorate of Rev. A. P. Prettyman, our present pastor, has been characterized by revival influences, resulting in valuable accessions to the church and general quickening of the church work; and
WHEREAS, He has won the respect and confidence of the people in the church and out of the church as few pastors before him have done; therefore,
Resolved, That he is hereby invited to return to us for the third year, and that the District Superintendent, Rev. Dr. Watt, is hereby respectfully requested to use his influence to this end.
