SPECIAL NOTICE

Assessment on Personal Property.

The Commissioners of Kent County, under order from the State Tax Commission of Maryland, are now sending out by mail, "Notices and Schedule for Assessment on Personal Property." You will receive two schedules, one to be filled in by the party or parties receiving it; the other to be retained by you for your own reference. You then go before a Justice of the Peace, Notary Public or come before the County Commissioners and make affidavit to the Schedule. This MUST be done before the Commissioners can accept it from you. Your notice will state just what day you must make the return, which means that you must make the return on or before that date. The Commissioners will sit in session on each day of the week EXCEPT SATURDAY, after you receive your schedule.

It is advisable that you read over your schedule carefully before attempting to make it up. By doing this, you will have no trouble. It is important that you see that your name and address is properly listed, District, Rural Delivery, etc., if any; if colored, so state. Personal property in your possession belonging to others, must be reported. See Section No. 23, on Schedule.
