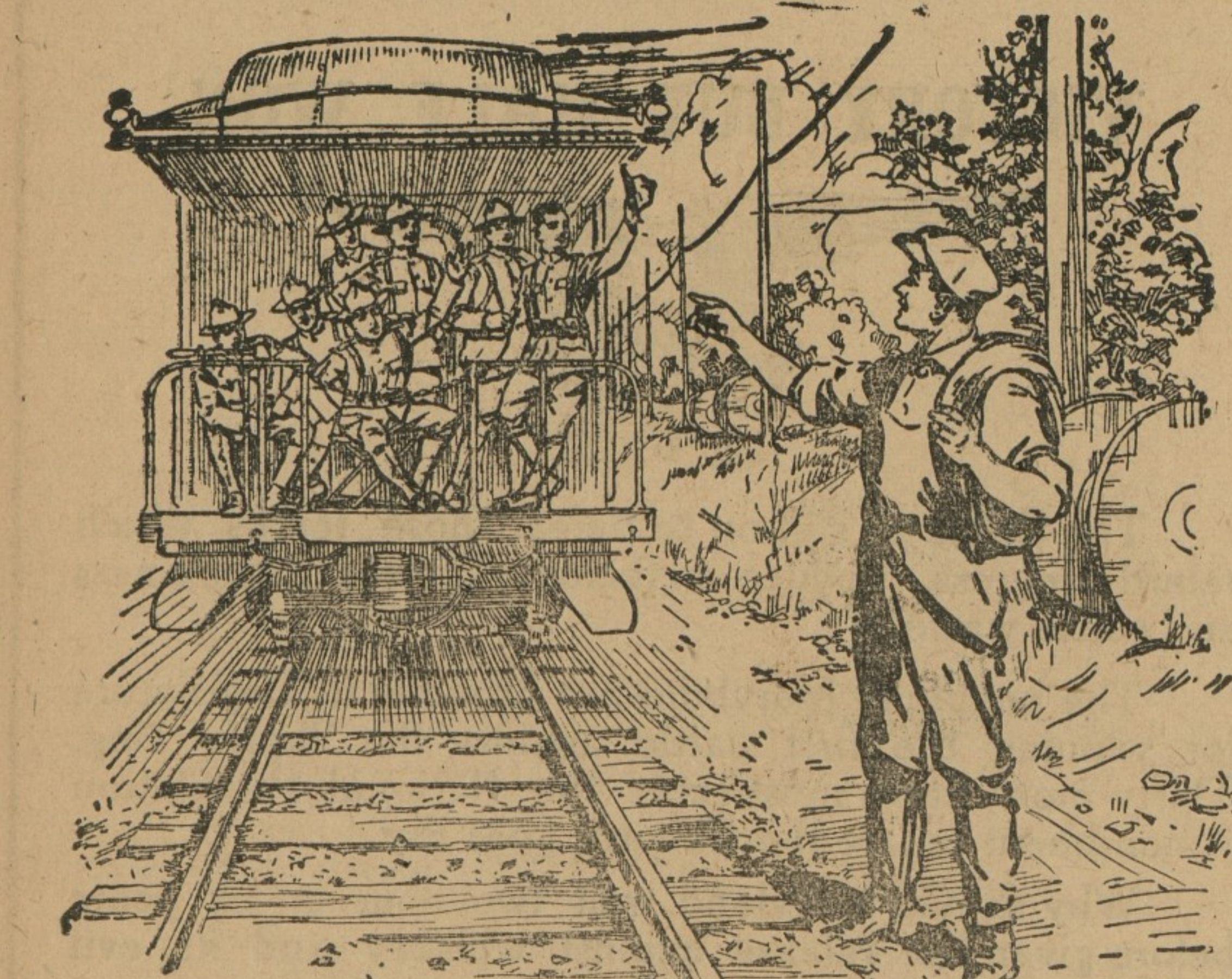

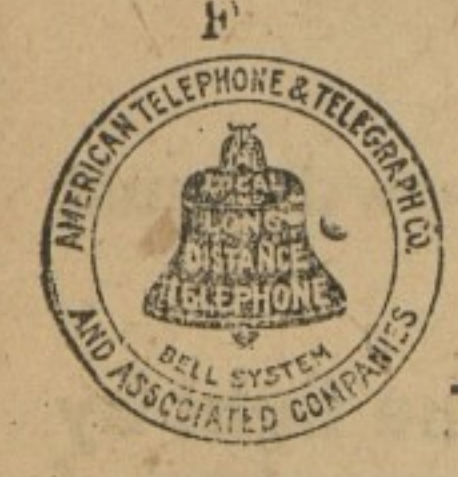

TEACH COOKING AS WAR MEASURE

Government May Adopt a Course of Instruction.

SUCCESS IN GREAT BRITAIN

Housewives Given Training Along the Lines of Economy, Including Also Ordinary Cooking for Times of Peace - Children Between Ages of Five and Fourteen Years Required to Attend.

In addition to the methods employed by Herbert Hoover in promulgating his economical suggestions, the government may soon adopt a course of instruction in cookery that has proved successful in Great Britain.

Course of Six Demonstrations. The course of instruction in each place consists of six demonstrations, one weekly, according to the following syllabus:

- 1. Voluntary rations; food that serves the same purpose as meat; how to get the best value for money. 2. Substitutes for wheat flour; use of oatmeal, barley, flour, maize (corn), meal and other cereals.

The pupils devote one-half day each week to this subject, although in certain districts pupils are withdrawn, either entirely or for at least half the week, from school duties during a period varying from three to six months falling within their last year at school, so that they may engage in the domestic work under as realistic conditions as possible...

Teach 65,500 in Month. In January, 1917, the 178 cookery centers, 56 laundry centers, 128 combined cookery and laundry centers, and 72 housewifery centers provided places in all for 65,500 children.

The foregoing comprises the schedule of obligatory instruction for girls between the ages of five and fourteen years. There are also the evening institute schools attended by all ages from fourteen to sixty, in which the plan of teaching is elastic, with a view to making the greatest appeal to the heterogeneous types of pupils.

HOW TO HELP UNCLE SAM WIN THE WAR FOR DEMOCRACY

Practical Suggestions From a Kentucky Lady That Are Worth The Reading

Herbert Kaufman says in the Cosmopolitan, "cook the Kaiser's goose on your own stoves." Victory over there is being weighed on grocer's scales. The flag out front signifies nothing unless it's also hanging in the ice-box.

Democracy is equally menaced by Glatton and Germany. Don't crucify civilization on a cross of knives and forks. God help a people that stints a field kitchen to stuff the home larder. It is a shoddy and pinchback loyalty that sends sons to the battle front, and won't spare a crust to comrades in arms.

Getting 50 per cent. only of flour is not a hardship, if we plan our meals for it. In looking over grocery orders for the past five years, I find that flour was only 40 per cent. of cereals, and we enjoy the change from the inevitable bread and meat. I wonder if the storekeepers could not suggest purchases to the customers who seem ignorant as to what is best to buy.

I find that an order like this comes out very well for us: 4 lbs. rolled oats, 4 lbs. meal, 4 lbs. buckwheat, 4 lbs. beans, 2 lbs. rice, 1 lb. cornstarch, 4 lbs. hominy; 8 lbs. Graham flour, 24 lbs. flour, and if you will use at least three baskets of potatoes with this lot of goods, you will have some flour left over when the other things are gone.

As a suggestion, I want to say, the cornmeal mush, made by stirring the meal free from lumps in cold water, then adding hot water and cooking for at least half hour, can be added to any kind of griddle cakes, muffins or light bread, if used at the rate of 1 cup of meal to three of flour.

GIANT AT FORT DODGE

University Man Is Six Feet Six Inches, and Weighs 245 Pounds.

The biggest man at Camp Dodge, according to officers who have given the men physical examinations, is Bernard Anderson of Litchfield, Minn.

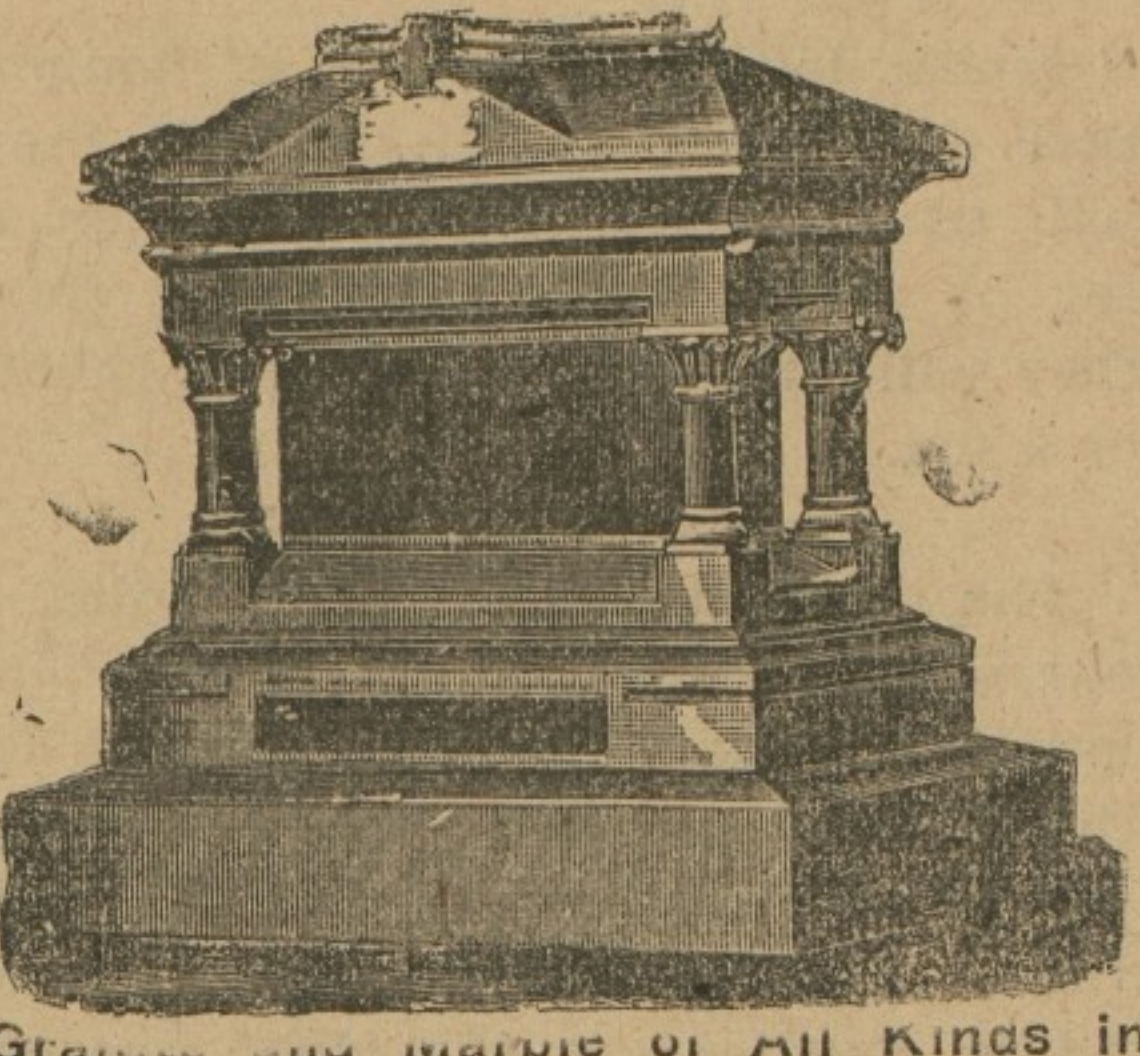
