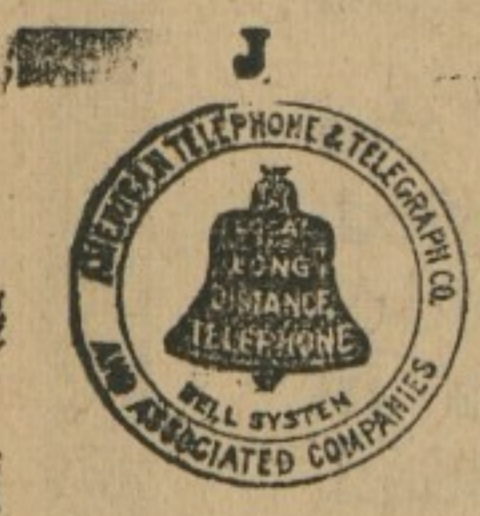
TEAM WORK IN TELEPHONING

WILMINGTON CONFERENCE IN SESSION AT DOVER

Ministers From Many Counties Gather For Business—Many Pastors Will Return

The Wilmington Conference is in session at Dover, Del., this week and Kent County pastors of the M. E. Churches are at the Delaware capital for the 50th annual session. Bishop Bristol, of Tennessee, is presiding.

Besides being the semi-centennial of the conference, that body having organized in 1868, it will be the 50th anniversary of the admission of C. W. Prettyman, who was changed from effective to retired three years ago. There are three older ministers in the conference—William W. Redman, G. S. Conaway and James Egates, who were ordained in 1858, 1862 and 1868, respectively, and were transferred to the Wilmington Conference at its formation. L. W. Layfield, who was admitted to the conference in 1871, is its oldest effective member. W. E. Tomkinson and T. H. Harding, also admitted in 1871, retired over 10 years ago. Other veterans include: P. H. Rawlins, ordained in 1869; J. A. Arters, John W. Poole and Adam Stengle, 1870.

C. A. Hill, E. P. Roberts and D. F. McFaul will retire at the next session.

E. C. Sunfield, retired one year ago, hopes to return to the effective rank in 1919.
