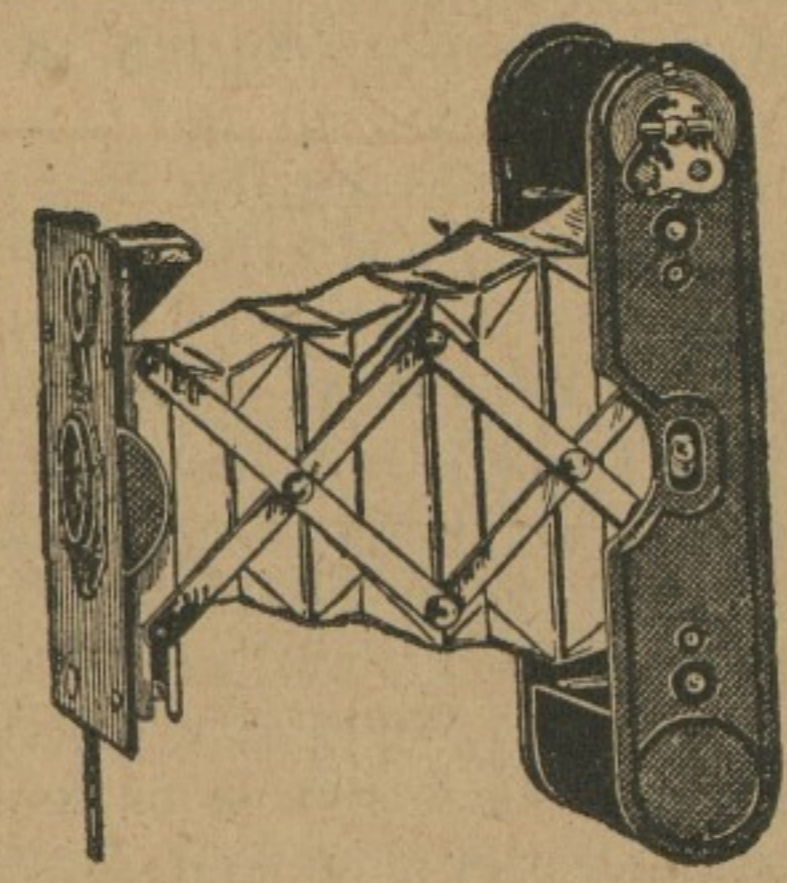

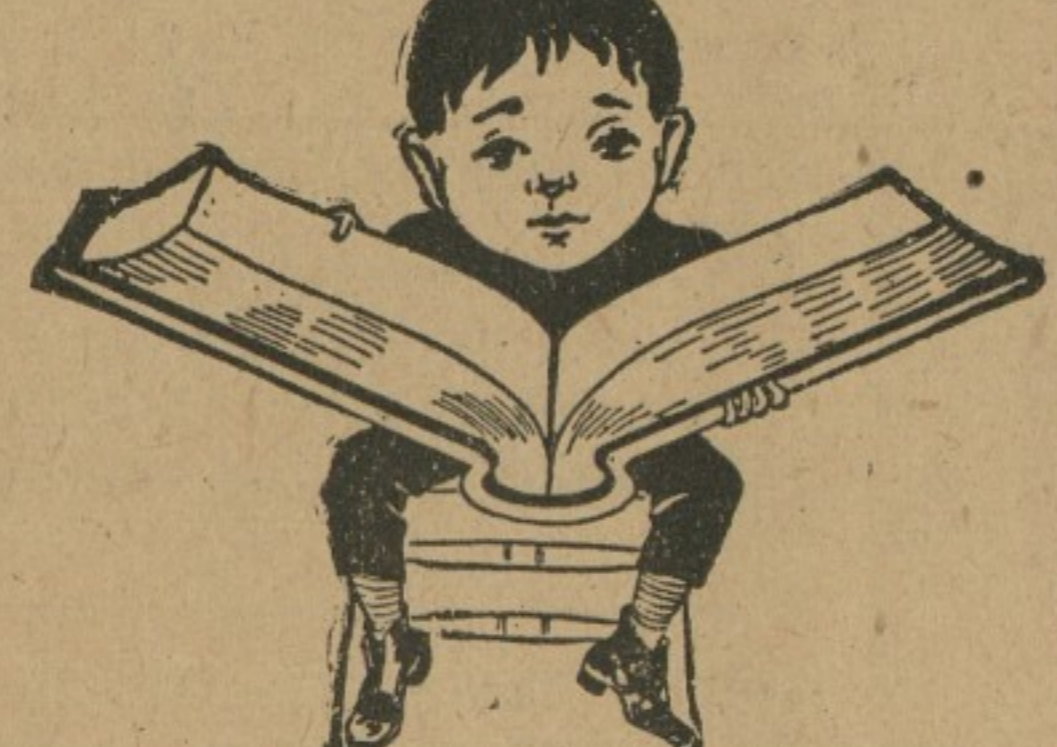

**Germans Making Another Drive.**

By concentrating superior numbers of soldiers upon much smaller numbers—thus sacrificing many of their men—the Germans are gaining considerable territory. Reports come from the headquarters of General Foch, the commanding general of the Allies, that the offensive will be stopped in a few hours. Already his great reserve army is rushing to the front and we have no doubt that by the time The Transcript reaches its readers the crest of the German wave will have broken against the iron resistance of the hero of the Marne.
