Tax Rate \$1.25

The Board of County Commissioners on Tuesday declared a tax rate for 1918 of \$1.25 as against \$1.44, which was the rate of last year. The state tax rate is 36 3/4 cents. The county and state rate combined is \$1.61 3/4. The tax basis of 1917 for real and personal property combined was \$10,131,000, while the basis for 1918 of real and personal property is \$12,113,357.

DR. JAMES W. CAIN RESIGNS.

Was Elected President of Washington College in 1901

Dr. James W. Cain, president of Washington College, tendered his resignation to the Board of Visitors and Governors of that institution Saturday evening last, which was accepted. Dr. Cain was elected president of this college in 1901, and under his guidance we have seen many improvements—the erection of William Smith Hall which was destroyed by fire in 1916 and rebuilt in 1917, the present fine gymnasium, the beautiful athletic field, a splendid heating plant for all the college buildings and other improvements that have added much to the advancement of the institution. The resignation of Dr. Cain came as a great surprise and was a source of regret to many of his friends and to many of the parents whose children are students or have been students at this venerable institution. Under his administration many students have graduated who have become prominent in the political and civic life of this and other states.
