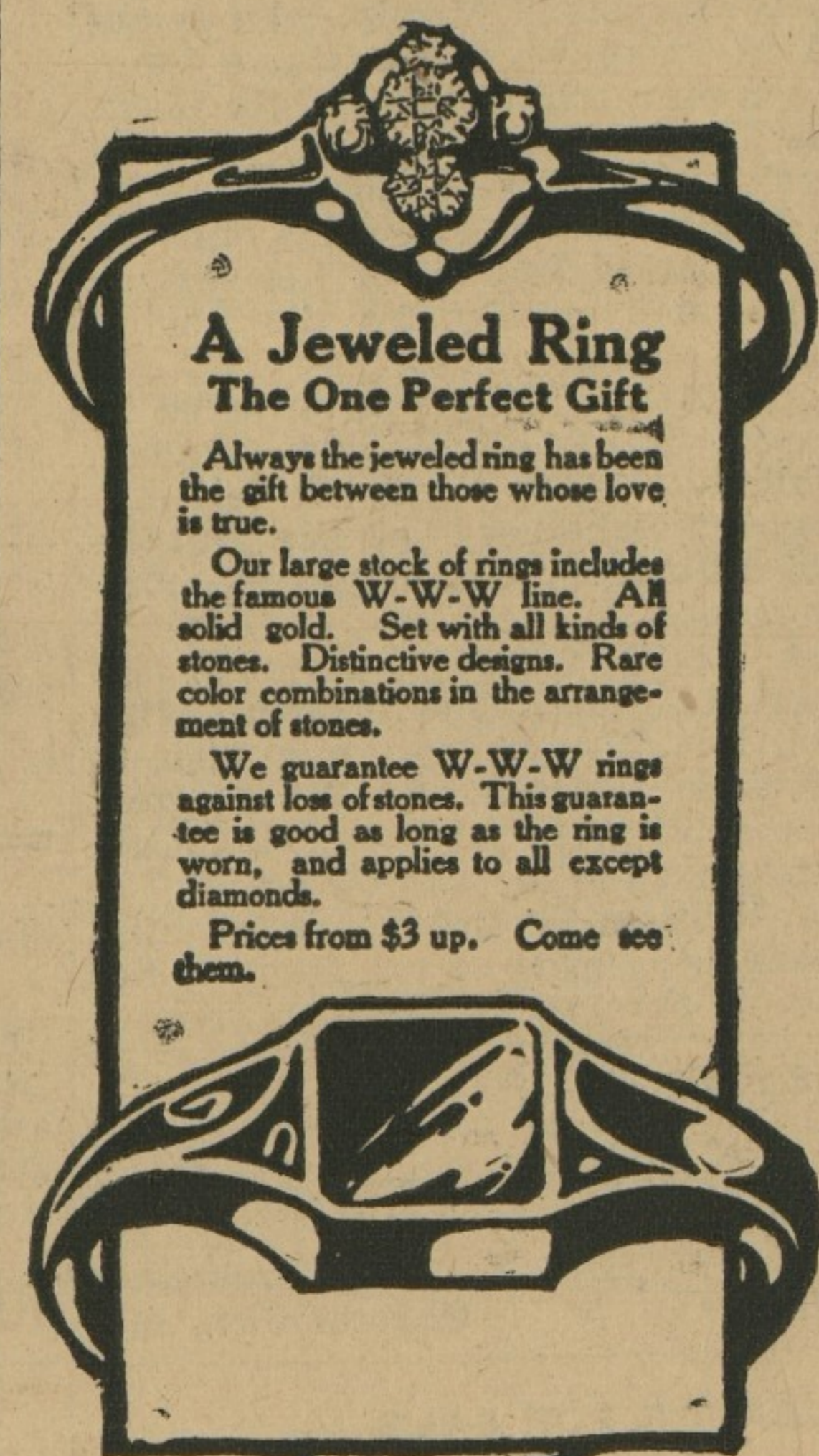

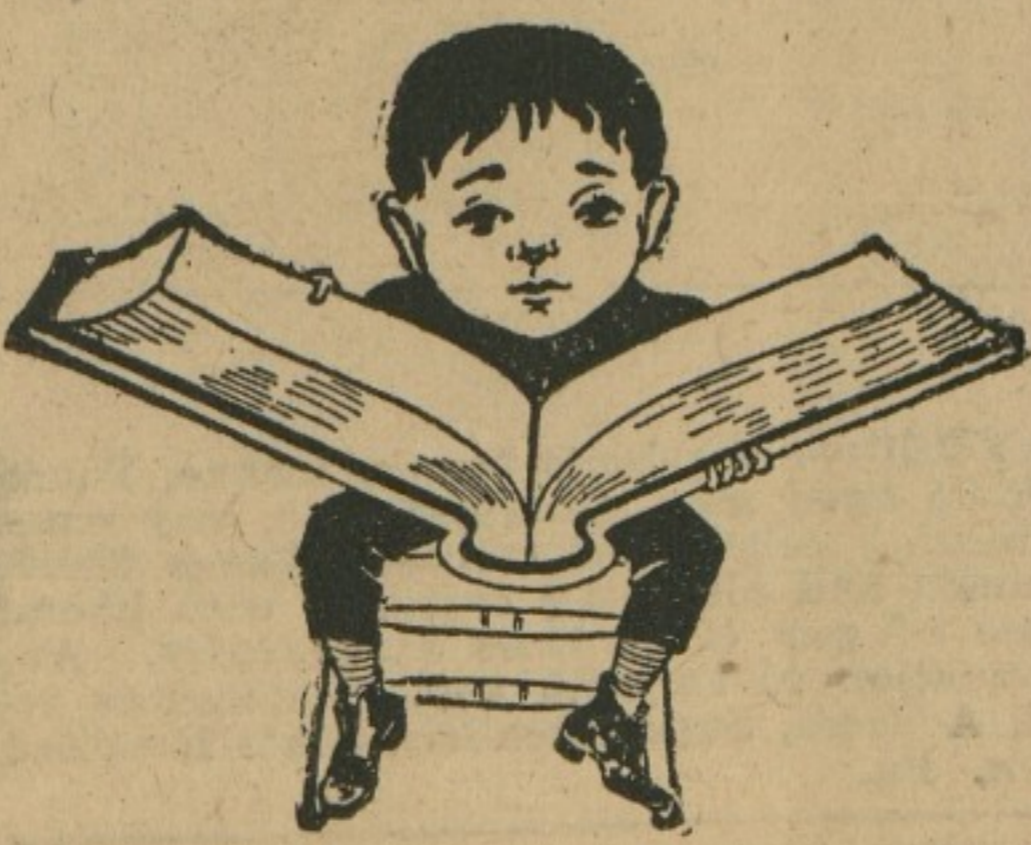

killed in action in France June 7. The
following telegram from the Adjutant
General at Washington, addressed to
Mr. James L. Caldwell, was received
at Galena Friday morning:

"We regret to inform you that Priv.
James W. Caldwell, engineer, is offi-
cially reported killed in action in
France."

A Letter From A Former Employee

Mr. William T. Blyman, a former
employee of the Transcript, writing
from somewhere in France, says:

"France is a very pretty country
and everybody seems to be very in-
dustrious, as the farms all look good
and the crops are in and growing. It
is a good place to live, if our people
were over here. But as mine are in
the States that is where I want to
come when this war is over. The peo-
ple all treat the American soldiers
fine. When we arrived in one town
they threw flowers in our path and I
was given a bouquet which I kept for
several days.

We can buy light wines, eggs and
milk, but I haven't seen any candy,
cake or tobacco and matches are not
to be had. I would love to tell you
about the trip, but of course you know
I can't do that. I can say that I was
very sea sick and so were lots of the
others. I cannot tell you where I am
or what I am doing, but I am getting
along fine. I am sure the Transcript
will be appreciated by more than one.
Spencer Smith is still with me and
is getting along fine and Dr. Lemen
was the last time I saw him. I don't
see much of Dr. Lemen, though, as I
stick pretty close to my quarters."

The County Commissioners are

the wharf with new boards. The re-
pairs were much needed. The M. D.
