Chestertown Party Robbed.

Threatened with annihilation by a
heavily armed negro highwayman, who
pointed a savage looking pistol into
their faces, a Chestertown couple
while motoring from this place to Wil-
mington recently were relieved of the
valuables they had with them, con-
sisting of jewelry worth upwards of
\$250, according to a Wilmington paper.

The hold-up occurred at about 9:20
o'clock at a lonely place on the road
leading north out of Odessa, a short
distance above the town. One of the
tires on the car had been punctured
and the party stopped there to make
repairs. The work on the tire had
just been completed and the party was
about to proceed, when the negro, who
evidently had been hiding in the heavy
underbrush along the road, sprang out,
pointed his gun and shouted "hands
up."

There was nothing to do but com-
ply, as the motor party was unarmed,
and the result was that the high-
wayman got a wallet, containing about
\$72, a diamond ring and wedding ring
and other jewelry from the lady, which
appeared to be satisfactory to the
thief, who next gave the command to
"get aboard, start north and don't
look back."

So the motorists started off and
went direct to Wilmington, seeing no
thing further of the negro and having
no more trouble.

James E. Caldwell

Last week we made mention of the
death on the fields of France of Mr.
James E. Caldwell, of Galena. He is
the second of Kent's sons to give up
his life in the interest of civilization
and his name will be placed on the
imperishable scroll of the nation's
heroes.

At the time of his enlistment he was
a book-keeper at Hotel Dupont, Wil-
mington. He was born in Galena 27
yrs. ago. He went to Wilmington when
a youth and took a course in Gold-
ley College, graduating with honor in
the class of 1914. "He was an exemplary
young man," said William E. Douglas,
president of Goldley College, "and was
distinguished for his faithfulness, up-
rightness, ability and high degree of
earnestness. He was exceedingly popu-
lar with students and faculty and was
held in high esteem by all who knew
him. It is with the deepest sorrow
that I hear of his death, but his life
has been given in a worthy cause."

Following his graduation from Gold-
ley College Mr. Caldwell obtained a
clerical position in the office of the
Delaware workhouse, later taking a
similar position with the Wilmington
Gas Co., going from the Gas Co. office
to the Hotel du Pont. At each place
he maintained the reputation he had
established at the college. He lived at
313 Madison street, Wilmington, prior
to his enlistment and enlisted in Phila-
delphia.

He was sent with his command to
France last September and had been
communicating with relatives here and
in Wilmington. He is believed to have
been the first Delaware boy to have
been killed in action in the war.
