Patriotic Fourth At Rock Hall

The amount of time and thought expended on the preparation of the various floats and cars was well repaid in the complete success of the parade; every phase of the times and conditions was illustrated.

Our Allies were proud of the beautiful girls chosen to represent them in the tableau that led the parade and one can imagine the Kaiser feeling a cold shiver run down his spine as his coffin went by guarded by the Boy Scouts and led by Uncle Sam—by the way, this Uncle Sam came out of a picture book, he was too typical to be real. Those who don't quite realize what "yellow dog" means and represents, should have studied carefully the car typifying what at one time threatened to be a menace to our country. That the Red Cross appeals very strongly to every one was clearly shown by the very large and beautiful section of the parade devoted to this cause. Food conservation was clearly and thoughtfully emphasized by an elaborately decorated car. The Belgium refugees made a strong appeal and they certainly were a happy bunch of youngsters and supplied half the music of the occasion. Our band, of which we were so justly proud, has been depleted by the calls of war, but the remnant that remains made a brave showing and the leader, who is, without doubt, the hardest war worker of us all, is still with us.

He had a message to deliver and he delivered it and it made a fitting climax to a day that will stay in our memories for a great many years.

Elevations In Kent County

The following is a table of the elevations above sea level of the different parts of Kent county, compiled by the Maryland Geological Survey.

The article and table are as follows: The surface of Kent county is essentially plain. The broad divide between Sassafras River on the north and the Chester River on the south is a terrace plain, ranging in elevation from about 45 to 80 feet. The southwestern portion of the county is a similar terrace plain ranging from sea level to about 25 feet in elevation. The stream valleys are broad and shallow and the only sharp declivities are found along the scarp separating the lower from the upper plain or where the streams have cut into the upland, as at Betterton, along Still Pond Neck and at Worton Point.
