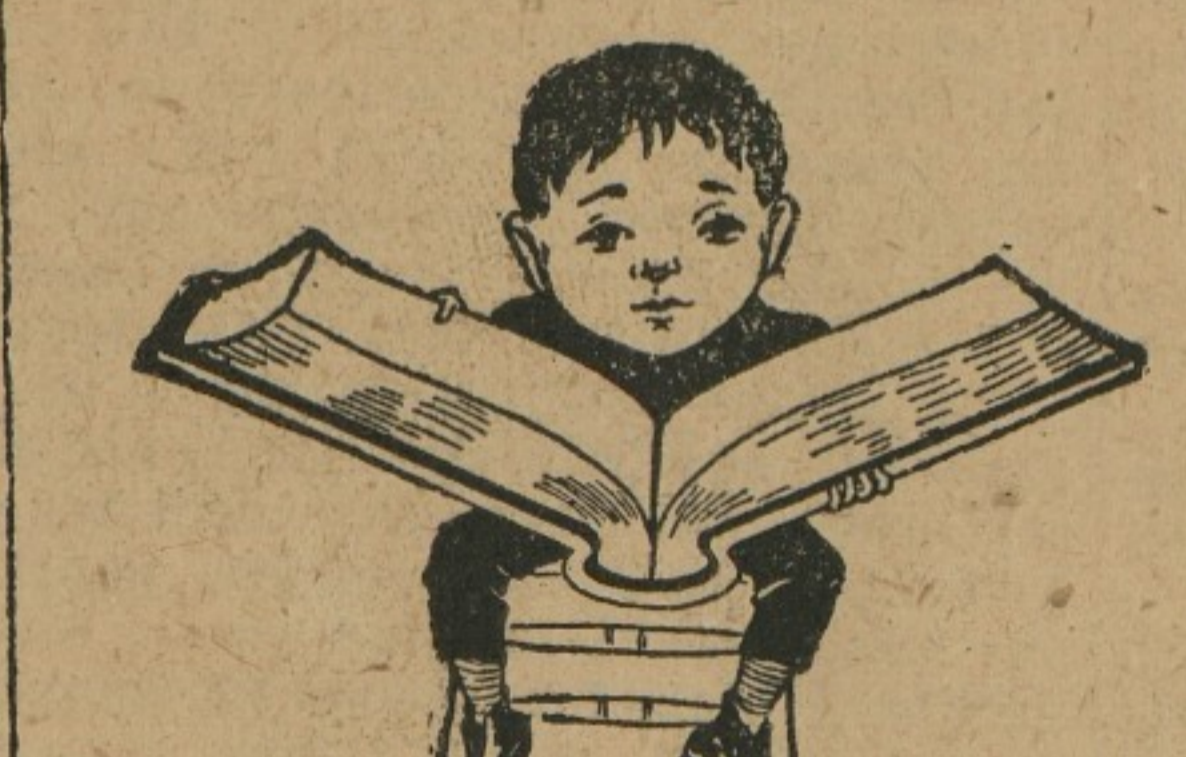

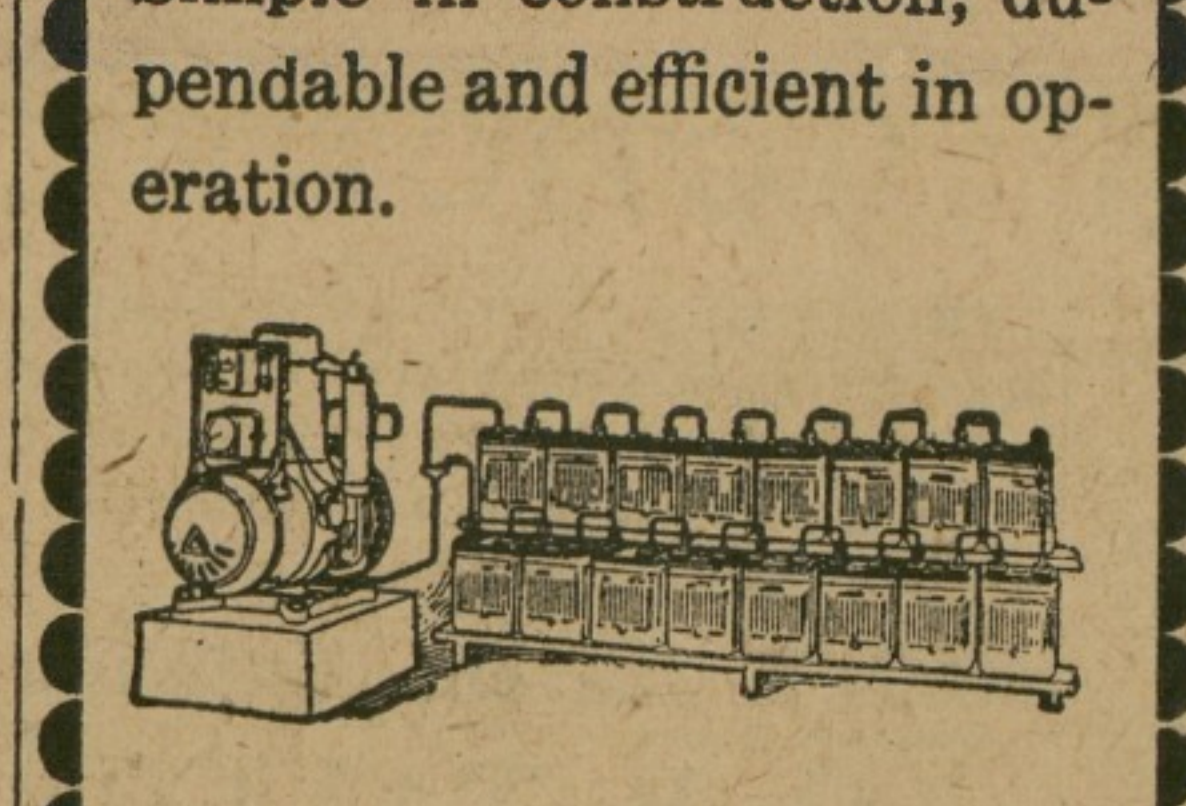

form a "boosters' club" for the pur-

ing them free sites and other induce-
