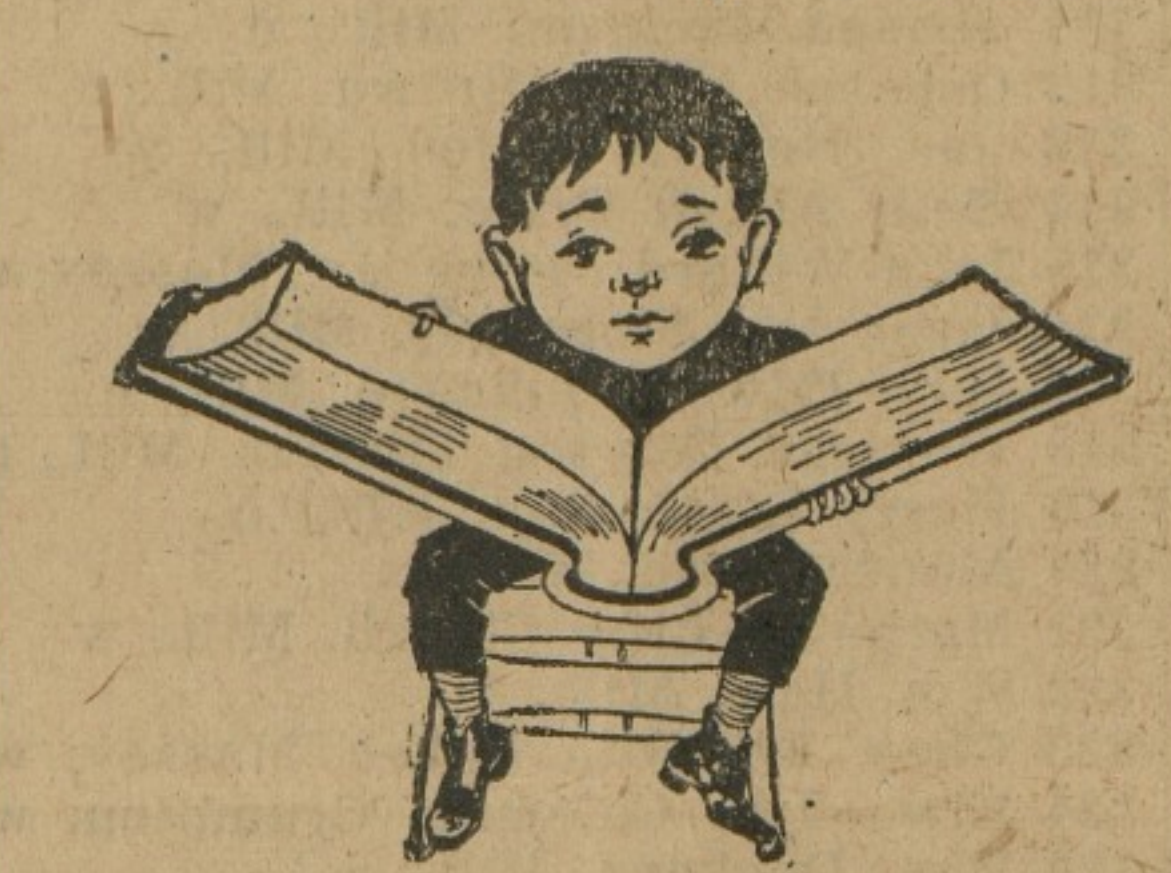

Interment in Chester cemetery. She is survived by a husband and two daughters, Mrs. Hicks Loller and Mrs. Mabel Joiner; and one son, Mr. John Skeggs. The following acted as pall-bearers: Messrs. Walter Barnes, M. P. Lee, Hero Kelley, George Hendrickson, James Walbert, Harry Richardson. Undertaker C. L. Dodd had charge of funeral arrangements.

Earle Palmatory, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Palmatory, formerly of this town, now of Wilmington, fell down an elevator shaft at the Du Pont Building in Wilmington Saturday last and had his neck broken. He was a helper for a pipetter and was carrying radiator fittings when he fell. He was on the seventh floor and he fell through a shaft. His remains were brought to Chestertown by train Monday morning and interred in Chester cemetery. C. L. Dodd undertaker. The following acted as pall bearers: Edgar Chaires, Clarke Davis, Clarence Armstrong, Floyd Coleman, Albert Craney and Bates Chaires. Rev. T. F. Beauchamp officiated.

Elizabeth Virginia, the 11-month-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Willis, died at the home of her parents on the Hurlock farm near Kennedyville on Wednesday morning of meningitis. The fourteen-year-old daughter of Mr. Arthur Johnson, who has been in this section for nearly a year working for Mr. Marion Malcomb, died a Terryman, Harford county, last Sunday from blood poison. Her trouble started with a boil on her foot, which developed blood poison and caused her demise.
