Rev. B. F. Ferguson was entertained to dinner on Sunday by Mr. and Mrs. Archibald.

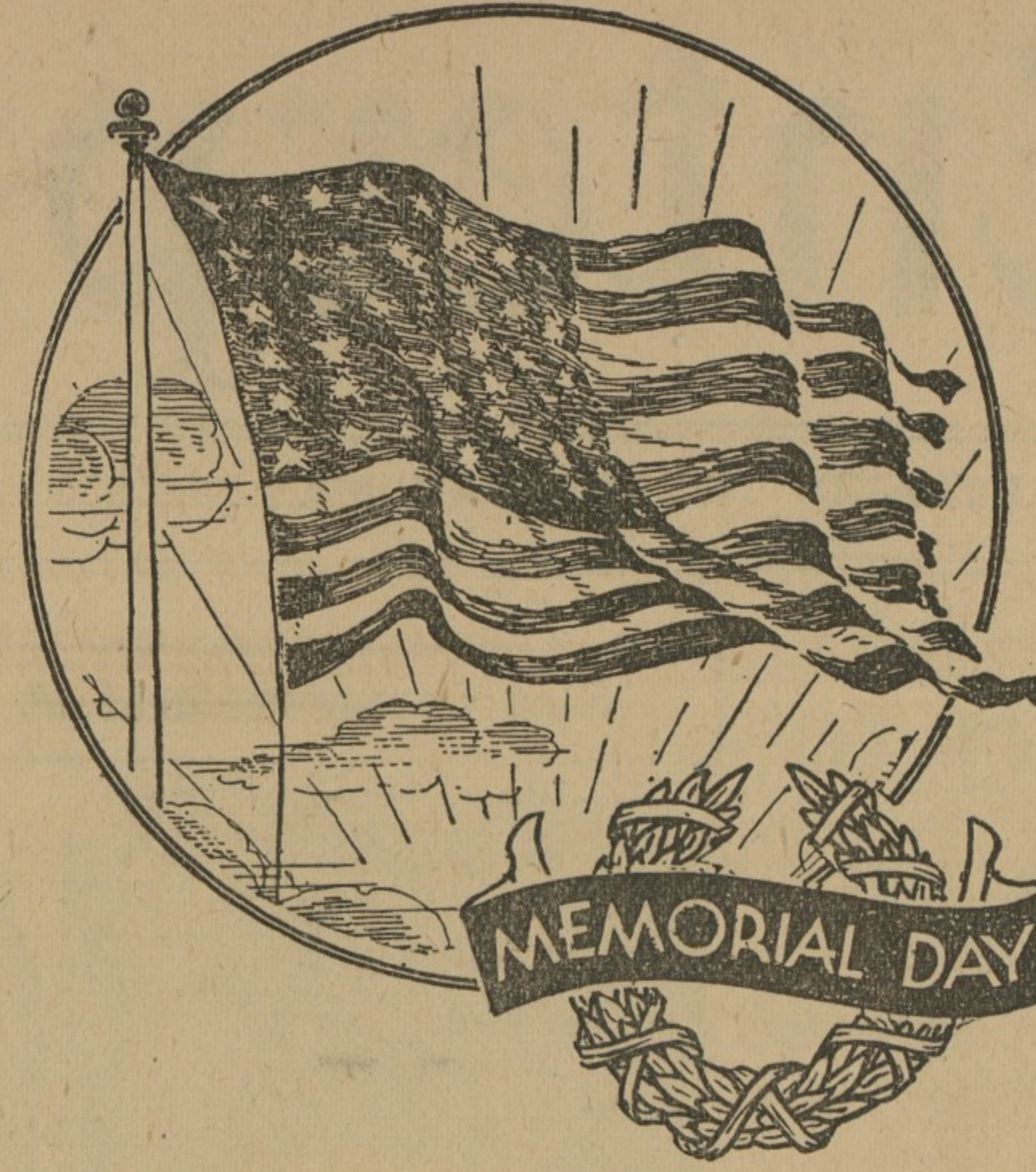
Mr. Ferguson is staying a few days this week in our community so as to visit the sick of his church or of any other denomination where he is needed and could be of any help.

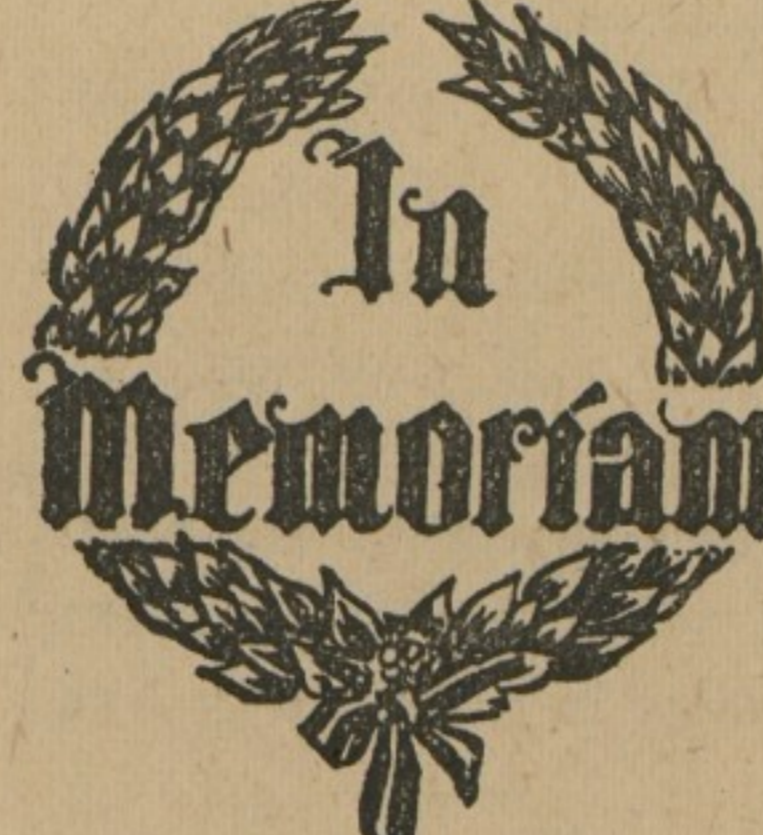
