That bundle of screen magic, five-year-old Shirley Temple, will soon be thrilling and delighting her army of local movie fans in a new picture. Reports from other cities indicate that in "The Little Colonel," Fox Film has given her an ideal vehicle for her acting, singing, and dancing talents. It will come to the New Lyceum Theatre on Monday and Tuesday, March 18-19.

COMRADES HONOR J. EDWARD POTTS, FIRST OF MARYLAND SOLDIERS TO DIE IN WORLD WAR

Church Hill.—Comrades of J. Edward Potts, first Maryland soldier to die in the World War, dedicated a shaft at his grave on Sunday. The ceremonies were conducted at the soldier's grave seventeen years and one day after he lost his life in the Lunenburg sector, battle of the Marne.

Arrangements for erection of the shaft were made last December by John H. Harman, of Catonsville, a buddy of Potts, who was with him when he died.

Tribute Paid To Dead Harman himself placed the shaft in its foundation after James T. Lean, president of the Maryland Chapter of the Rainbow Division, had read the American Legion ritual, followed by a tribute to the dead sailor by Dr. H. E. McMains, chaplain, and a prayer by the Rev. Walter C. Eastburn, chaplain of the Jeff Davis Post, No. 18, of Queen Anne's County.

Three airplanes of the Maryland National Guard from Logan Field, Baltimore, dived over the cemetery as the shaft was placed. A military salute roared over the quiet grave, followed by the sounding of "Taps" by Frank L. Willis, of Centreville.

At attention by the grave stood twenty-seven members of the Jeff Davis Post, under Com. A. Sydney Gadd, Jr., twenty-three members of Potts' own One Hundred and Seventeenth Trench Motor Battery of the Rainbow Division, and the Company K firing squad, under command of Lieut. Victor P. Gillespie and John Walravca.
