Vote Upon the Purchase of the Water Works

Vote upon Paying Commissioners a Small Salary.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that an election will be held at the Court House in Chestertown, Maryland, on

Monday, April 27th, 1908,

for the purpose of electing one person to serve for three years in the place of William S. Carroll, one of the town commissioners, whose term expires on that date. Polls open from 9 A. M. to 6 P. M.

And by virtue of Chapter 382 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1908, the qualified voters of Chestertown, shall purchase the Water Works for the purpose of supplying the town with water.
