LIGHTNING'S WORK.

Men Knocked To The Ground And Killed Near Galena—A Sudden Flash Startles Chesterdown.

About 4:30 p. m., Thursday the people of Chesterdown were startled by a sudden and terrific crash followed by a bolt of lightning which played about the News offices, making the employes and others therein think they had been shot. The rooms were filled with smoke and all electric and telephone connections were burned out. We thought this building was the centre of attraction but upon investigation find that nearly every one in town experienced the same fright.

Mr. F. P. Cochran and his tenant, Mr. Hiram S. Powell, of near Galena, had a harrowing experience. They were at work in the asparagus patch with six Bohemians and were driving four horses to cultivators. When that terrific bolt came Mr. Powell and the Bohemians fell to the earth as if shot while one horse was killed outright and another was stunned. The men have all recovered from the shock at this writing.

A cow and hog were also killed on Mr. Cochran's place but they were in the meadow. Hail fell in large quantities and rain stopped all work.
