GOOD ROADS COMMISSION VISIT KENT

Gov. Austin L. Crothers and Members of Commission Receive a Cordial Greeting Tuesday in Chestertown — \$108,000 to be Spent in Kent County at Once—The Route Selected.

Governor Austin L. Crothers, chairman ex-officio of the Good Roads Commission; John M. Tucker, chairman; Dr. William Bullock Clark, Samuel M. Shoemaker, F. C. Hutton, members; Chief Engineer Crosby and J. C. Bowerman, secretary, arrived in Chestertown Monday night from Elkton.

Notwithstanding the early hour of meeting the court house was filled with representative farmers and citizens. Senator Wm. M. Slay called the meeting to order in an appropriate manner and Mr. Alfred C. Loud, president of the Levy Court, was made chairman.

Gov. Crothers' Remarks. Before getting down to the real mission of the visit—learning exactly the needs of the section from men who know them—Gov. Crothers outlined the aim of the Commission, which, he said, was to provide with the most judicious expenditure of the funds a system of highways that would in time place the State in the foremost rank of development. Said he: "It is a great pleasure for us to be here and to look into your familiar faces again. We are here on this occasion to start in Kent a great benefit. The Legislature passed a law providing for a bond issue of \$5,000,000 for the purpose of building State roads, \$1,000,000 of which is to be expended near Baltimore, and placing the construction of same in the hands of the men with you today. Our visit to you today is for the purpose of giving the people of Kent an opportunity to locate roads for this improvement. We appreciate the fact that it is natural for each one to want the road near his farm or road gate, but it is desired that you will all take a broad view of the enterprise and select the road which will be of greatest benefit to the greatest number of people. The purpose is to take the main thoroughfares and connect same with those of other counties.

As far as possible it is desired to direct the trade to Baltimore and it will soon be found that every citizen will get some benefit. It will tend to enrich and build up the whole county. If you don't get the road that you want, you'll get the one the other fellow wants! There is no place where I'd rather see this road built than on this splendid Eastern Shore where we want the roads to be a duplicate of the people and we all know they are far from it now."

Chairman Tucker stated that there would be \$108,000 available for Kent county and that this amount would build 25 to 30 miles, the distance depending on the cost of gravel or material. He also stated that the State will maintain these roads after they are built!

He stated that in Cecil county which adjoins Kent on the north, there were \$140,000 available and at the meeting held there on Monday the following route was about agreed upon:

Begin at Conowingo Bridge; thence almost in a straight line to Rising Sun; thence to College Green, to Mechanicsville, to Elkton, and thence southward to Chesapeake City, and thence across the Bohemia river; thence through Cecilton to Fredericktown. At Fredericktown the route crosses the Sassafras River to Georgetown, where Kent county is entered.

The amount of money each county gets is dependent on the number of miles of road.

Views of Citizens. It was difficult to get the farmers and citizens to talk on the subject until Marion deK. Smith, Esq., offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS the plan of the Good Roads Commission is to build a continuous State road and said road having been brought through Cecil to Kent at Georgetown, therefore be it

Resolved, by the citizens of Kent county, in convention assembled, That the State Road Commission is requested to avail itself of the plan and specifications now in the hands of the Maryland Geological Survey relating to the stretch of road leading out of Centerville toward Church Hill, and commence the building of said road at its earliest opportunity.

The Governor and party traveled from Centerville to Denton in automobiles. The machines did not stand the journey well, thus showing the great need of better roads on the Eastern Shore.

The Commissioners of Chestertown have purchased of Rev. S. S. Hepburn a fine horse to match their other cart horse for \$175.
