KEPT "OPEN" HOUSE.

Arthur Diggs, Colored, Arrested at Fredericktown, For Violating The Local Option Law—Officers Found a Cart Load of Demijohns and Bottles.

Shortly before 12 o'clock Saturday night Sheriff Henry G. Hager, Deputy Sheriff McAllister jumped out of the carriage went to the front door and applied for a half-pint of whiskey. Diggs recognized the officer and stated that he had a drop about the house. The other officers by that time were alongside of the deputy sheriff and all of them walked into the house, placed Diggs under arrest and then proceeded to make a search of the premises. They found about two gallons of whiskey and enough empty demijohns and bottles to fill a horse cart. For some time past it is alleged, Diggs had been keeping an "open" place selling large quantities of both whiskey and beer, contrary to the Local option law. The residents of that part of the county made complaints to the officers, but for some unknown reason no one could be found who would inform on the violator of the law. State's Attorney Constable decided to make a raid upon the place and carried out his plans Saturday night. Just before the officers were ready to leave the house, a stranger came to the house and walked inside. When he saw the officers he started to leave, but was stopped and asked what he wanted, replying "Nothing." The officers found that the man had a half-pint bottle and 25 cents in money in his pockets. At his first opportunity the stranger left the house post-haste.

The General Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church in session at Baltimore has completed the election of Bishops. The last four Bishops elected were: President Edwin H. Hughes, De Paul University, President Wm. S. Lewis, of Morningside College, Sioux City, Iowa; Rev. Dr. Frank M. Bristol, pastor Metropolitan Church, Washington. The four Bishops elected previously were: Rev. Dr. William F. Anderson, of New York; Rev. Dr. John L. Nulsen, professor of West Theological Seminary; Rev. Dr. Charles A. Quayle, of Chicago; Rev. Dr. William W. Smith, of Pittsburgh. These men are regarded as worthy to follow the list headed by Cook and Astbury. They are considered the pick of the thousands of ministers of the church and among the foremost churchmen of today. In intellect and moral strength they will constitute a big addition to the present board of general superintendents, of which there are only twelve in active service.
