LINEN THE FINEST FABRIC.

Always considered the "Purest Covering" - Why it is cooler than Cotton. Why is linen cooler than cotton? Why is linen, aside from its cost, always preferred to cotton? Ancient writers tell us that the people of their time shared the present day preference for linen. The wise Apuleius says: "Can any one be impressed with a sense of religion wonder that a man who has been made acquainted with so many mysteries of the gods should keep at home certain emblems and wrap them in a linen cloth, the purest covering for divine objects, for wool, the excretion of the sluggish body, taken from a sheep, was deemed a profane attire even according to the early tenets of Orpheus and Pythagoras? But flax, that cleanest and best production of the field, is used not only for the inner and outer clothing of the most holy priests of the Egyptians, but also for covering sacred objects? Herodotus' plain statements that show that linen was as highly regarded in his day as it is now. A man wounded in an engagement, he says, has his torn clothes bound up in linen, supposing that the persons concerned had their choice between linen and cotton, there can be no doubt that they would choose linen as most suitable for such a purpose. Cotton when applied to wounds irritates them."

Good Conductor of Heat.

The cooling quality of linen as compared to cotton is due to the fact that the structure of the flax fiber makes it a good conductor of heat and one that freely condenses the vapor of perspiration. Notwithstanding the fact that the cooling quality of linen when applied to wounds has been well known for only lately that an absorbent linen surgical dressing has been produced under the name of "oxolint." This is one of the by-products of the first American linen mills established at North Brookfield, Mass., and operating under a method of manufacture that accomplishes in a few hours the work that requires from eight to ten weeks by European methods of linen making. The World Today in an article on this innovation says: "The one reason why linen fiber has never been made in this country is that the European process would be too impossibly expensive unless carried out by labor of the very lowest cost. There is no labor in the United States cheap enough for this purpose, and for this reason Americans have been sending over \$20,000,000 a year to Europe for linen. Now mills have been built in Massachusetts to operate the Mudge process, and there is an assured market for the millions of dollars' worth of flax straw that we have been burning up for years and a chance to get linens for little if any more than the present cost of fine cotton fabrics."

HONOR FOR INVENTOR DELANY

Receives Gold Medal For System of Automatic Telegraphy. Formal notice has been given by the secretary of the Franklin Institute to the committee on science and the arts has recommended the award of the Elliott Cresson gold medal to Patrick B. Delany of South Orange, N. J., for his system of automatic telegraphy. The Delany system is controlled by the Teletop company, which is now building up a national telegraph system to compete with the Western Union and the Postal. The Delany automatic apparatus sends and receives at the rate of a thousand words a minute. The economies it makes possible in operation and construction are so great that the new company has already announced that it will charge only a cent a word for telegrams between any two points on its lines. Among inventors the Elliott Cresson medal is one of the highest valued. It is bestowed under a deed of trust dating from 1848 which restricts awards to "some discovery in the arts and sciences or for the invention or improvement of some useful machine." This latest honor earned by Mr. Delany follows the highest awards for his telegraphic inventions from the Pan-American exhibition and the St. Louis world's fair.

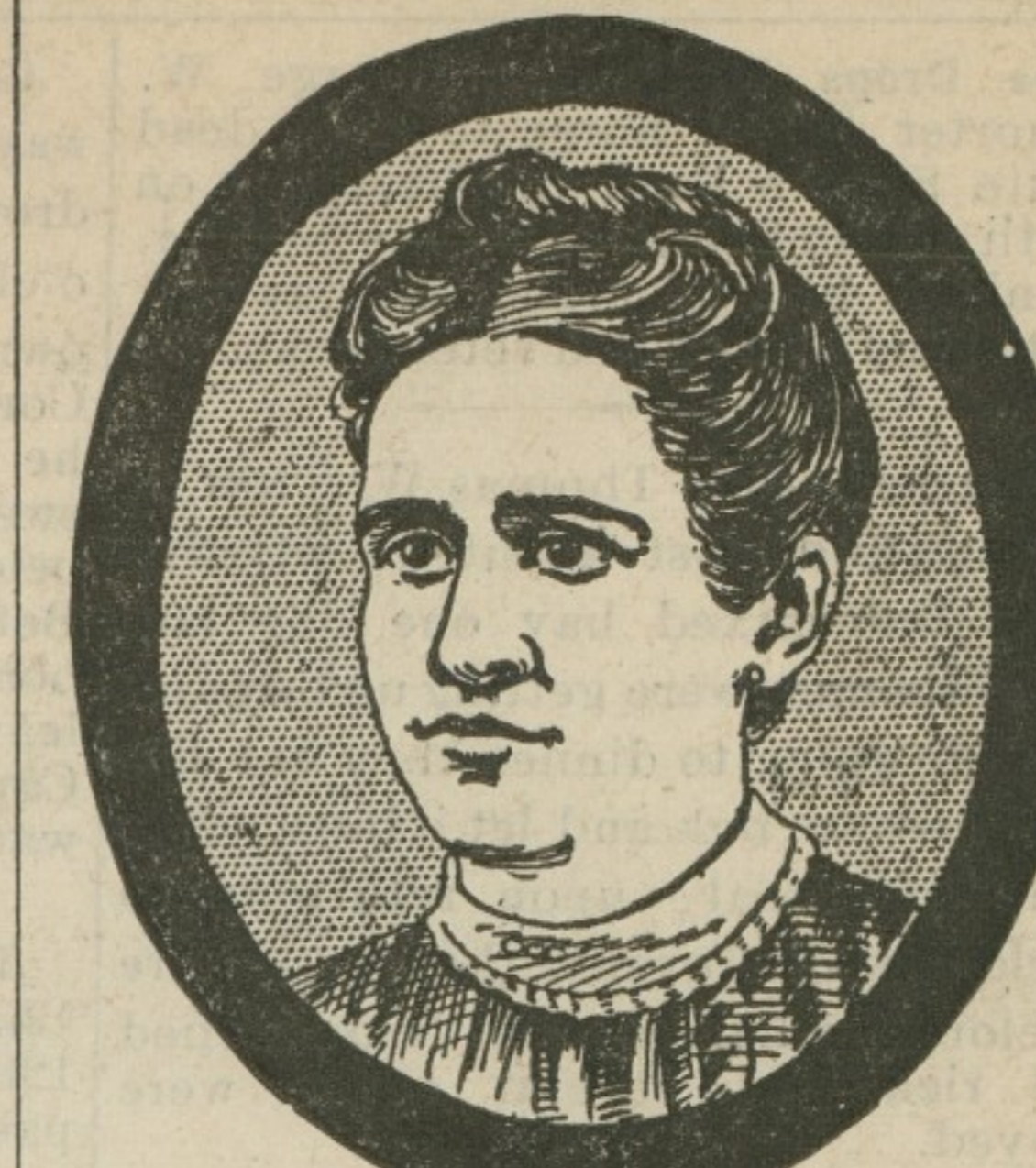
GERMS IN PLAYING CARDS.

London Medical Authority Points Out New Danger of Bridge With Old Used Packs. "Dangers hitherto unsuspected lurking, it appears, in the innocent playing cards," says a special cable to the Pittsburg Times, "and packs that have been used more than once are hotbeds of deadly microbes which deal forth colds and influenza to the luckless bridge player. "This is the latest discovery of the Lancel, the current number of which contains an article discussing cards from the hygienic point of view. Packs of cards which have been circulating for weeks at bridge parties sooner or later get soiled by constant contact with the human hand, and an examination would doubtless show an appalling selection of micro-organisms. "From his article it would appear that the American hostess is a little more careful than her English cousin, for no American woman would think of putting before her guests cards which have been 'circulating for weeks.' It would be well for the English matron to adopt the American rule to have fresh, clean cards on her tables for each entertainment. "Cleaning Gate Valves. PLAGUE IN CASTROLAND

Defying Edicts, Black Death Has Spread Until the Whole Country Is Now Under the Ban of the Outside World.

Once more public interest is centered upon Venezuela, this time by the outbreak of the bubonic plague in President Castro's realm. For his temerity in reporting that it was the "black death" that made its appearance at La Guayra the medical man who first investigated the disease was promptly clapped into jail. Castro did not want the commercial world to shut his port. But soon it was impossible to conceal the real state of affairs. The "black death," as it is still officially called, spread to Caracas and other cities. Castro squandered the efforts of the United States to induce him to take the necessary sanitary precautions, and by June the whole country was under the ban of the outside world. From the trade viewpoint conditions in Venezuela could hardly have been worse even before the plague made its appearance. The American Exporter has this to say on the subject: "Venezuela's Main Spring. Castro is more than a dictator. He is sometimes suspected of having stolen a leaf out of the diplomatic books of the sublime porcos, but one leaf only. Secure in his littleness and hedged round with problems that make foreign interference extremely difficult, he confidently plays his game of bluff, but in subject, crass ignorance of the elementary principles of courtesy and good breeding as they prevail in the family of nations. It is not to be wondered at. Even the sultan of Turkey would be rich in natural resources. It cannot be developed until a honest and stable government is established that will confirm the security of foreign investments which are vitally essential. "Castro has undeniably robbed and plundered every foreign capitalist who has attempted to exploit the country's riches, but Venezuela must see error of her ways and tempt foreign capital, guaranteeing peace and security, before her commerce and industry can be reclaimed from their present condition of chaos."
