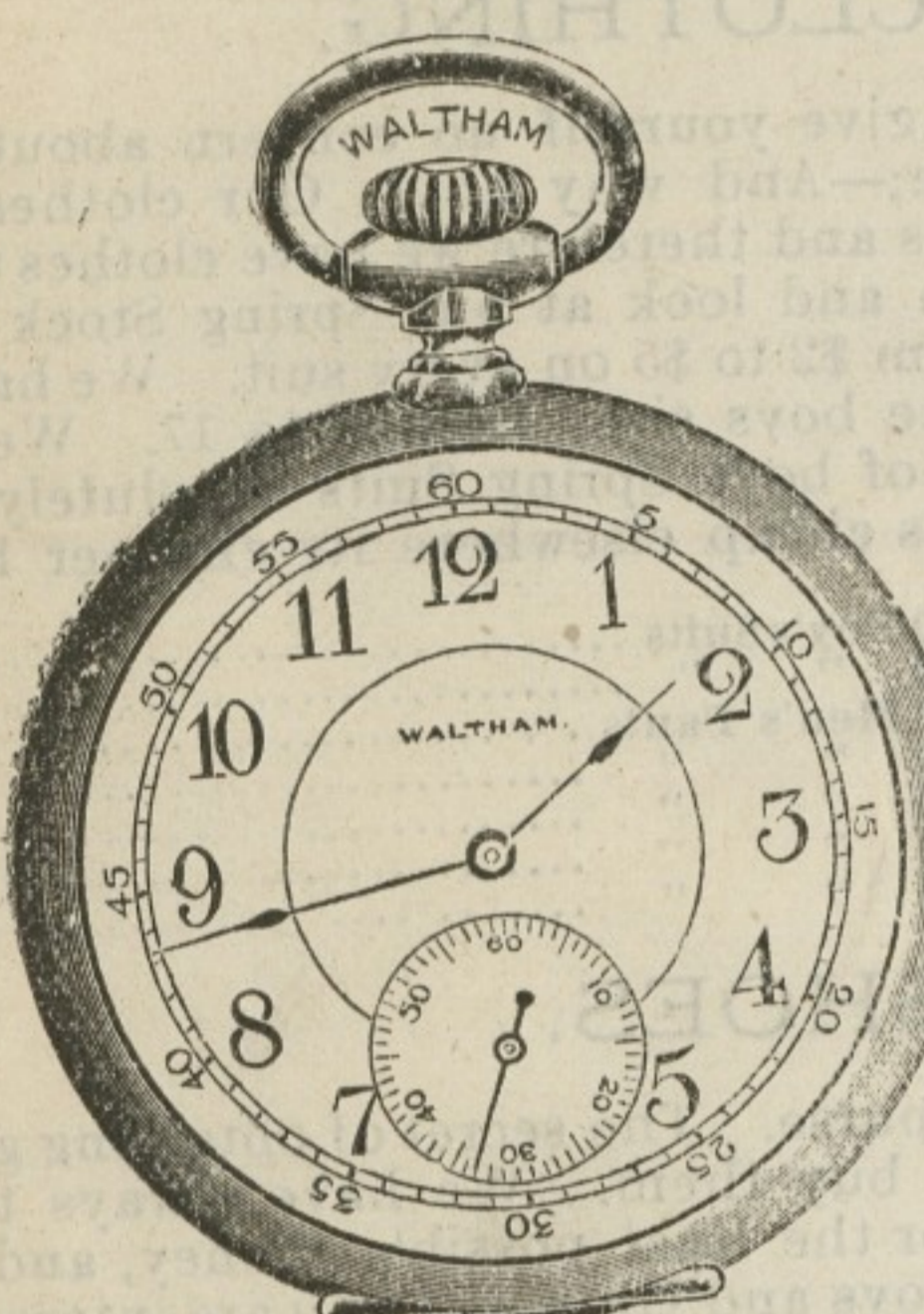

Outbreak of Yellow.—The reports coming in from inspectors of the State Horticultural Department show that peach yellows is again becoming abundant in the northern counties of the Eastern shore and that this destructive disease of peach is still alarmingly prevalent in the mountain peach orchards as well as in all northern Maryland where growers have not kept it cut out.

State Pathologists J. E. S. Norton says that only vigorous effort of orchardists to keep the diseased trees cut out as soon as the premature fruit appears, this being the surest sign of the disease, will prevent the loss of a large part of our orchards.

Horse Notes.—Mr. J. A. McClary lost one of his Tolchester riding horses recently in a singular manner.

Bernard Monday, Jr., a well-known young farmer of Rockville vicinity, noticed Monday that five of his horses, which were grazing in a field on his farm, were behaving in a strange manner, and he at once sent for a veterinary surgeon.
