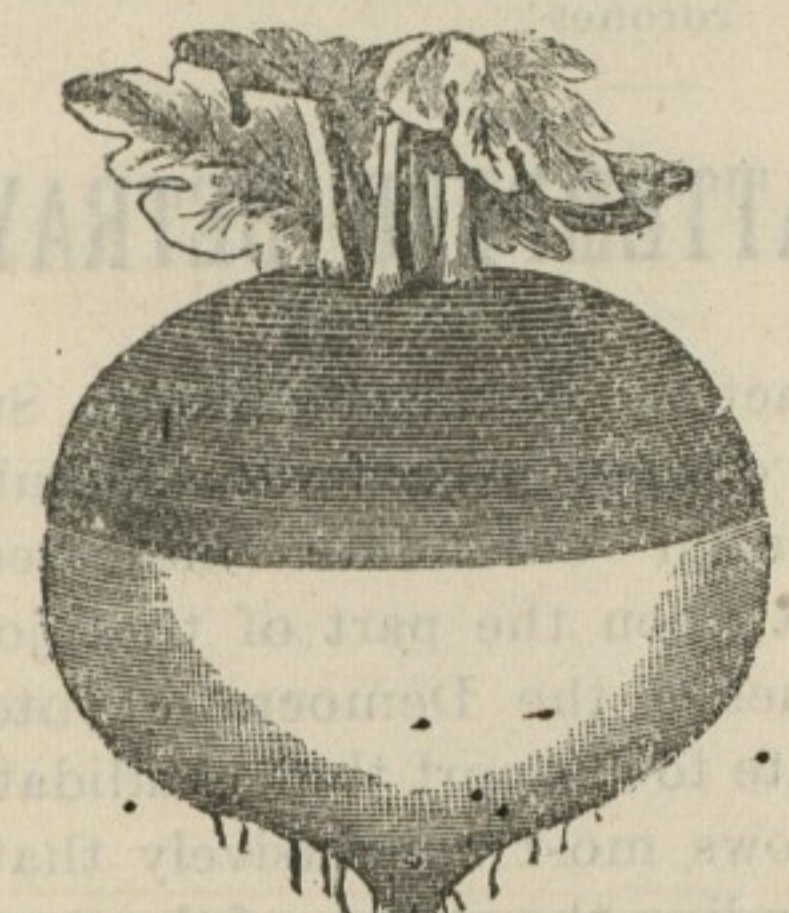

WHISKEY AND A WOMAN CAUSE OF MURDER!

Having been drinking and because "Rags" Harvey paid too much attention to a certain colored woman, Henry Grinnell, Herbert Brookins, Ed. Johnson and Elie Bailey concocted a plan to get "Rags" out of the way. Last Saturday night near Sharp's wharf, Rock Hall, "Rags" was struck over the head, his throat cut and body tied to a boat and carried out in Rock Hall harbor and sunk. Constable Jack Scoone, of Rock Hall, arrested Grinnell and lodged him in Chestertown jail on Monday. Brookins, Johnson and Bailey were jailed on Thursday.

The body of "Rags" Harvey was found floating in the creek near Sharp's wharf on Sunday morning. An examination disclosed unmistakable evidence that the man had been killed and thrown into the water. His head was battered and his throat cut. A pool of blood and other marks of a struggle were plainly visible on Sharp's wharf. Both men were employed on Capt. Middleton's vessel.

A hearing was held before Justice Wilkins and the four negro men held for the October Grand Jury.

Grinnell has told several stories about the affair and says it was all over a woman and that he had been drinking that night.

State's Attorney Beck and Officers Hadaway, Lockerman and Scoone are sifting the affair thoroughly.

EPIDEMIC OF TYPHOID.

One Person Dead And Seven Others Sick—Thought Eating Ice The Cause.

Eating ice cut from Lloyd's Creek near Still Pond is thought to be the cause of an epidemic of typhoid fever among prominent people around Turner's Creek. Mrs. Bulah Anthony is dead and her seven-year old son and her sister are very low with typhoid now.

Mr. Harry Price is very ill with the fever as is also a colored boy and another at Mr. Price's.

The ice house of Mr. Anthony was filled with ice from Lloyd's Creek which drains from a cannery near Still Pond and it is thought this may account for the cases. Dr. Geo. Jones is also ill with typhoid, but he developed his case at Galena. The physicians are doing their utmost to relieve the sufferers and it is hoped no more deaths will result, although information yesterday afternoon from Mr. Price was that he was very low.
