Shot Two in a Buggy.

A colored boy about 14 years of age named Joseph Thompson, and living near Melitota, tried his skill on marksmanship Saturday afternoon on two colored boys riding along the road in a buggy—Arthur Johnson and John Pearce, of Georgetown, employed at Mr. Wash, G. Skirven's. These boys stated that Thompson was on the roadside with the gun and when asked what he was gunning for, replied, "a hog." Then as the two boys drove off the gunner called, "look out, I'm going to shoot at you." And he fired, considerable of the shot taking effect in the shoulder and back of Johnson and Pearce but most of it struck the back of the seat. The wounded boys were attended by a doctor but are not seriously hurt. Thompson was arrested Sunday and is now in jail awaiting court.

OUTBUILDINGS BURNED.

Mr. Henry Brown, Quaker Neck, Loss 12 Buildings, 250 Bushels of Wheat, 20 Tons of Hay, Etc.

The cook at Mr. Henry Brown's in Quaker Neck was the first one to discover a fire in the stable about 7.30 p. m. Monday. Mr. Brown and his brave daughter, Miss Nina, at once released the horses and stock. Help came from every direction so that several wagons, carriages and some harness were saved. The pump was soon burned but the creek afforded abundance of water. Eight men with tubs saved the dwelling which was alive several times.

Every outbuilding except the meat house was destroyed, there being 12 buildings burned, besides 250 bushels seed wheat, 50 bushels of oats, 20 tons of hay, implements and 9 geese.

The outbuildings were insured in the Kent Mutual for \$1088; the contents of barn for \$800 and implements for \$500. Mr. Brown estimates his total loss at \$3,000 with an insurance of \$2,000. He will rebuild at once.

Mr. Brown received his check yesterday for his loss on personality from J. G. Beck's agency.
