FOUNDERS' WEEK, PHILADELPHIA.

From October 4 to 10 Philadelphia will celebrate the 225th Anniversary of the City's founding by a series of remarkable events.

On Monday afternoon 25,000 soldiers, sailors, and marines will parade. The Police and Fire Departments will parade on Tuesday afternoon, depicting their development from the earlier times. Wednesday afternoon will witness one of the greatest industrial parades ever seen in this country. Over 100 floats will illustrate the evolution of the City's industries. A great river pageant will be given on Thursday afternoon, in which 500 vessels including United States and foreign warships will participate. Fifteen thousand uniformed Red-Men with historical floats will parade in the evening. On Friday the first great historical pageant ever given in America, illustrating by 40 floats and 5000 costumed characters the history of Philadelphia, will be the grand climax of the celebration. The P. O. S. of A. will parade in the evening. Saturday will be devoted to athletics, motor races, and Knights Templar parades. The city will be specially illuminated every night and a musical-historical drama "Philadelphia" will be given every evening on Franklin Field. Special tickets to Philadelphia will be sold October 2 to 10, good to return until October 12, at reduced rates; minimum rate \$1.00. See Ticket Agents.

FALL FASHIONS

Fall and Winter Millinery—Large and Small Hats—Trimmings—Feathers—Flowers—Chevots—Stripes and Checks—Jackets—The Directorate Skirt.

Shapes and trimmings in Fall and Winter millinery are varied enough to suit all tastes, and while large hats attract most attention just now, small and medium-sized hats are by no means overshadowed. The "turn-down" brim is seen in hats of many sizes, and these will be tilted back over the detestable Pompadour roll. It seems impossible to escape from manufactured plumage, and besides enormous wings, the cockade effect in dropping cocktail feathers, appears on very expensive hats. Bengaline, Ottoman silk plain or mirror velvet, are the materials most in vogue for hats, and flowers of various kinds are used on or with any of these fabrics.

This is another fashionable millinery fabric and combines charmingly with flowers of all descriptions, and is laid in lovely folds or waves, or sometimes forms the sole trimming, of several shades however.

For dressy wear broadcloths lead, and the display made by Lord & Taylor is simply fascinating. So many beautiful shades from which to choose, causes one to linger at the counters covered with these charming materials, before the final choice is made. Plain broadcloth, handsomely trimmed makes an elegant reception or evening suit, and striped or checked broadcloth is equally desirable for the unpretentious tailor suit. Chevots also are in unusual variety and between diagonal, chevron, broken stripes or combinations of color in tiny herring bone stripes, selection becomes a puzzling matter. The Summer's bordered patterns in checks on stripes re-appear, and in the hands of a tasteful dressmaker, very effective results are attained.

Considerable variety and contrasts as well as apparent in new jackets, a large proportion being tight-fitting, others are double breasted, and a third style is quite long and almost tight, with the pockets at each side. The latest model is the "Empire" coat, with of course the short-waisted effect, collarless, with full sleeves and open cuff. Their size renders them quite expensive, at the same time they cover and protect the entire costume. Made of silk or satin and trimmed around the neck with a fancy band they are very attractive for evening coats, nevertheless blue in dark tones seems favored, and cover cloth in several shades will certainly be popular.

The walking skirt remains full around the bottom, but as tight as ever around the hips. Probably it will be a little longer than those of the now waning season. The Directorate skirt is a silly affair, only suitable for in-door or carriage use, and impossible to cut and make except by high class dressmakers. As it should commence under the best line and be fitted to the figure, it is a work of art. Only two seams are admissible, one at each side with a habit back, or one at the center back and another at the side, where it opens to show an underskirt.

Taxpayers will please take notice that taxes will be due and payable Sept. 1st and that on all bills unpaid on January 1st interest will be charged (unless all taxes unpaid are declared by law to be in arrears, and delinquents will be warned April 1st, the claims against them will be placed in the hands of the Sheriff of the county, who will proceed to seize and sell their property to pay the taxes due with charges and all costs of sale.
