PLENTY OF COURT WORK.

The October term of the Kent Circuit Court begins next Monday. There are now 33 civil cases docketed among the number being two \$5000 railroad suits removed from Cecil and a case from Caroline county. There are 7 appeal cases and 33 suits. There are 22 criminal cases on the docket left over from past terms.

Five murder cases are also on record to be tried and a large amount of other business.
