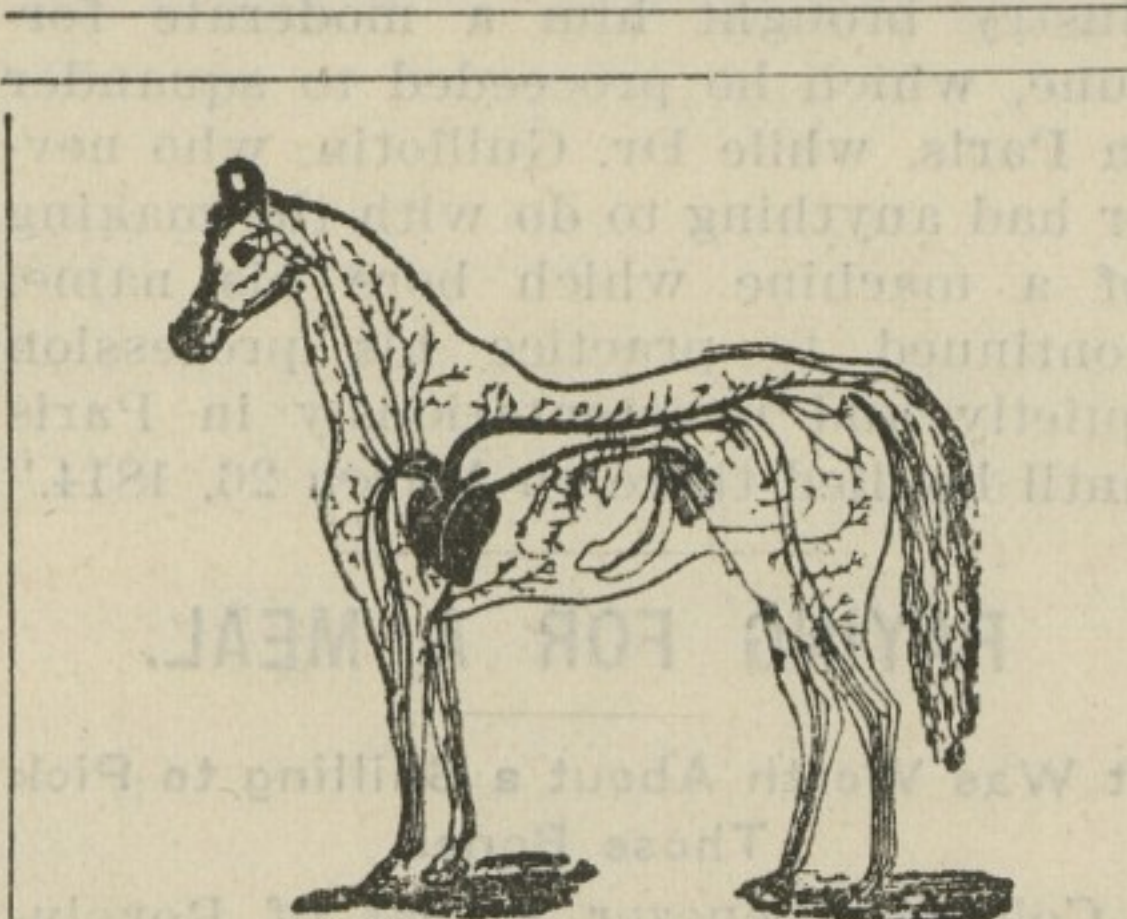

PRISONERS CARRIED OVER. Sheriff Hadaway Delivers Seventeen Convicts to House of Correction and Penitentiary—Writ Served on Grinnell. Sheriff Hadaway assisted by his son and officer Thomas V. Simpson carried 17 prisoners over on the Ford Monday, five of whom went to the penitentiary, eleven to the House of Correction and a white boy to the House of Reformation.

On the way to the boat Brookings got a slim chance at Grinnell and gave him a knock with his fist. These are the two men who were implicated in the Rock Hall murder, the former having been sentenced to 8 years in penitentiary and the latter set free by Court but afterwards rearrested and sentenced by Justice Medders to 2 years in House of Correction for carrying concealed weapons.

A writ was served on Grinnell Monday charging him with assault with intent to kill. Brookings asked the Sheriff for permission to "get at" Grinnell remarking that he would then be willing to serve his sentence.

Six negroes were arrested in Chestertown for playing crap Sunday and each fined \$2 and costs by Judge Loid.
