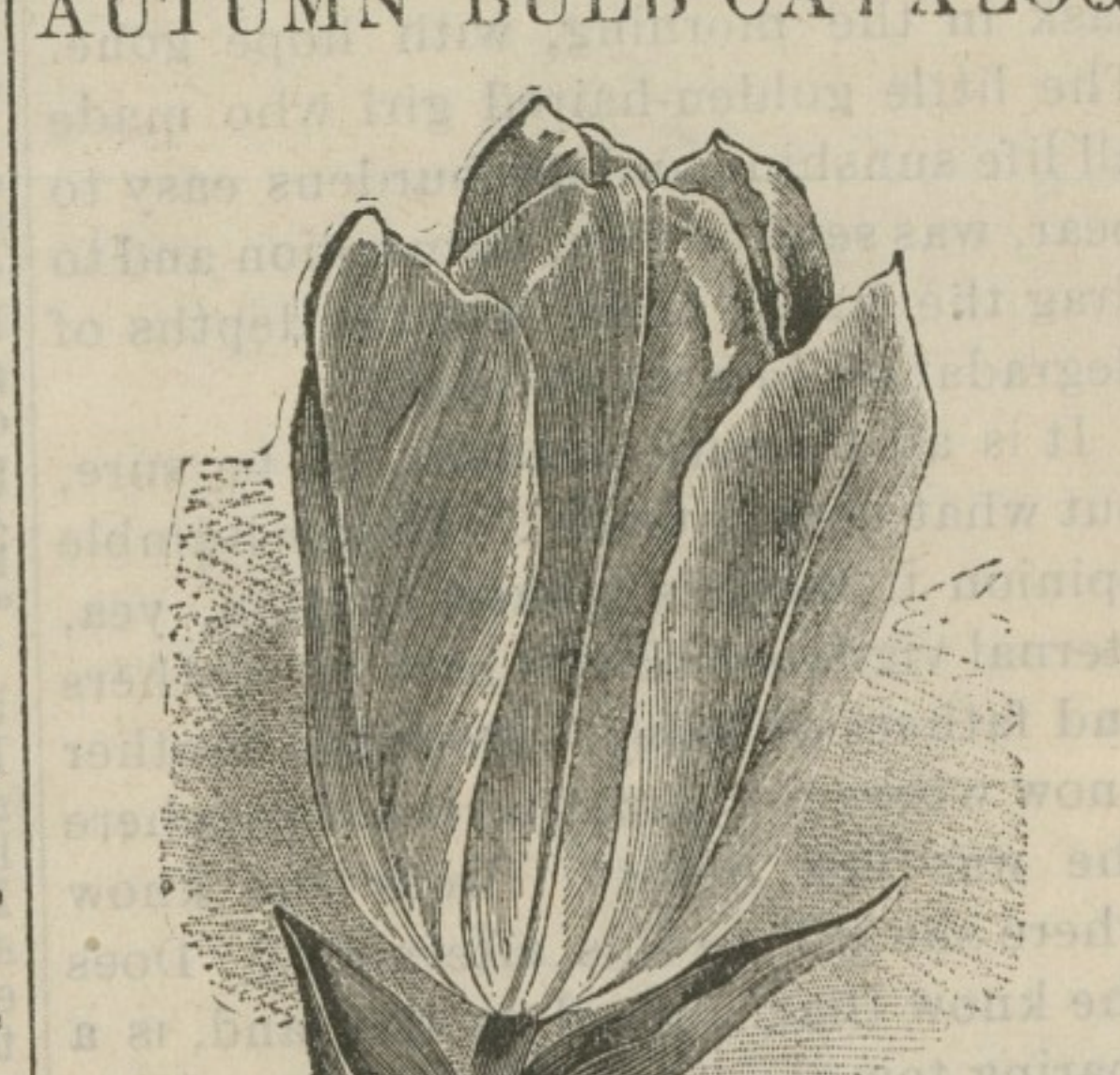

A NEW MUNICIPAL BUILDING

Chesterdown to Have a Home for Its Fire Company and Offices for Town Officials.

There's light ahead. The dream of many well-wishers of Chesterdown seems at last to be nearing a successful realization. A fine building as a home for the Volunteer Fire Company, and offices for the Town Commissioners and Water Board is now being arranged for. On Monday evening last Town Commissioners, W. S. Carroll, G. D. Lohland and Thos. S. Bortley met with the Volunteer Fire Company and the situation was thoroughly discussed. The Volunteer Fire Company, under the energetic leadership of President Thos. D. France, have been giving their time, money and talents in an effort to give Chesterdown a fire-fighting equipment that will be a protection to the homes and lives of every citizen. They have been insisting upon an equipment and home. They have met encouragement in every quarter. A subscription list was started two weeks ago among the citizens of the town and they are responding finely. Monday night the Commissioners put the finishing touches on the project by agreeing to pay one-half of the cost of a new building. They will pay their share of the cost in yearly installments over a series of years. The Commissioners have already spent over \$1000 for equipment. The Volunteer Fire Company will undertake to raise one-half the cost of the building by private subscription among the citizens of the town and by entertainments, etc. The building committee is composed of Messrs. Geo. H. Cannon, A. M. Culp and Wm. B. Usilton, Jr., and they estimate \$2500.00 will cover the cost of the structure. The building will be about 32x48 situated on Cross street near Cannon, and constructed of cement block for side walls and white sand brick for the front. A bell tower will adorn one corner of the structure within which will be placed a 600-pound bell which has already been donated by a young lady of Baltimore whose name will be announced later. Work on the building will be begun at once and it is expected that it will be finished by July 1.
