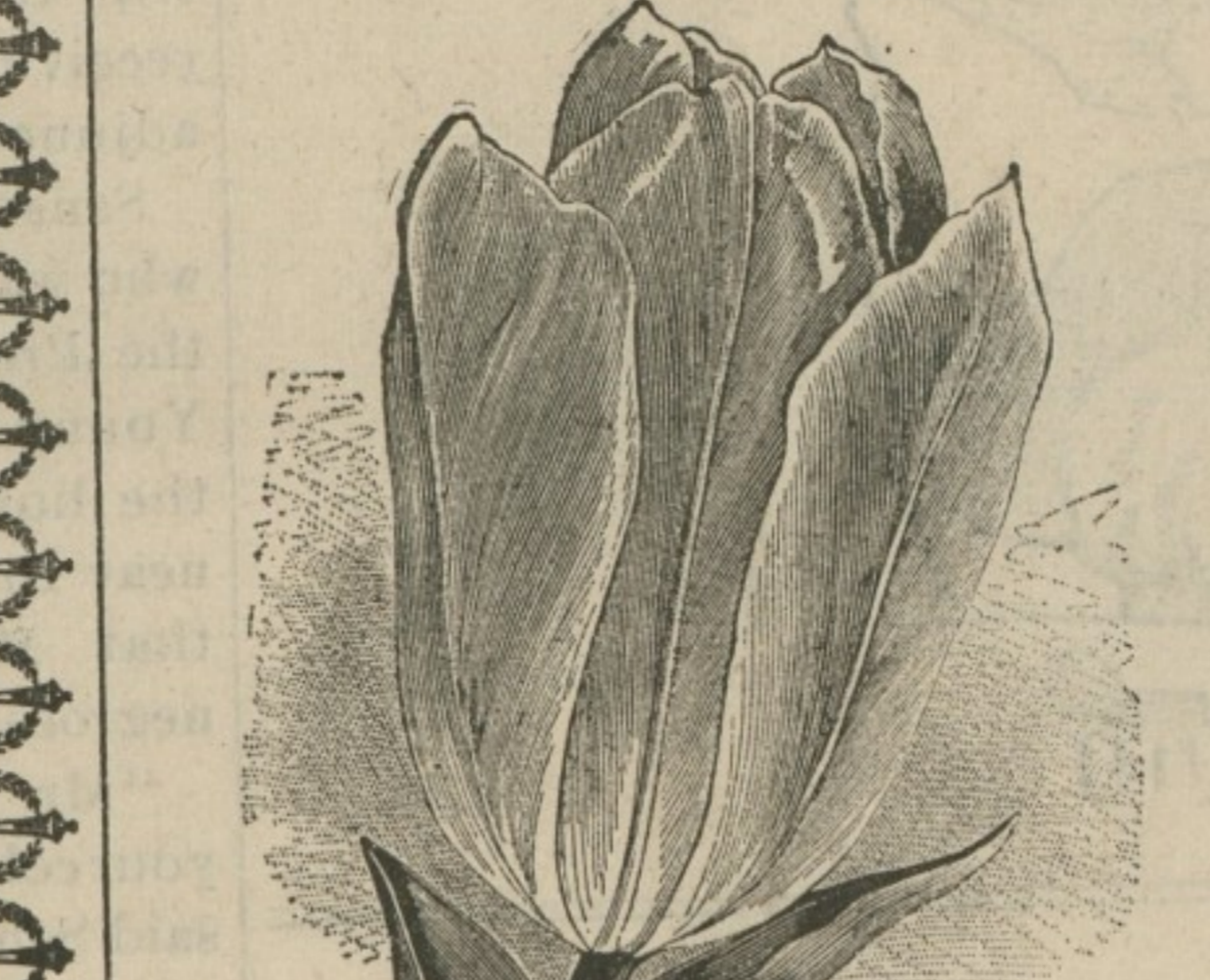

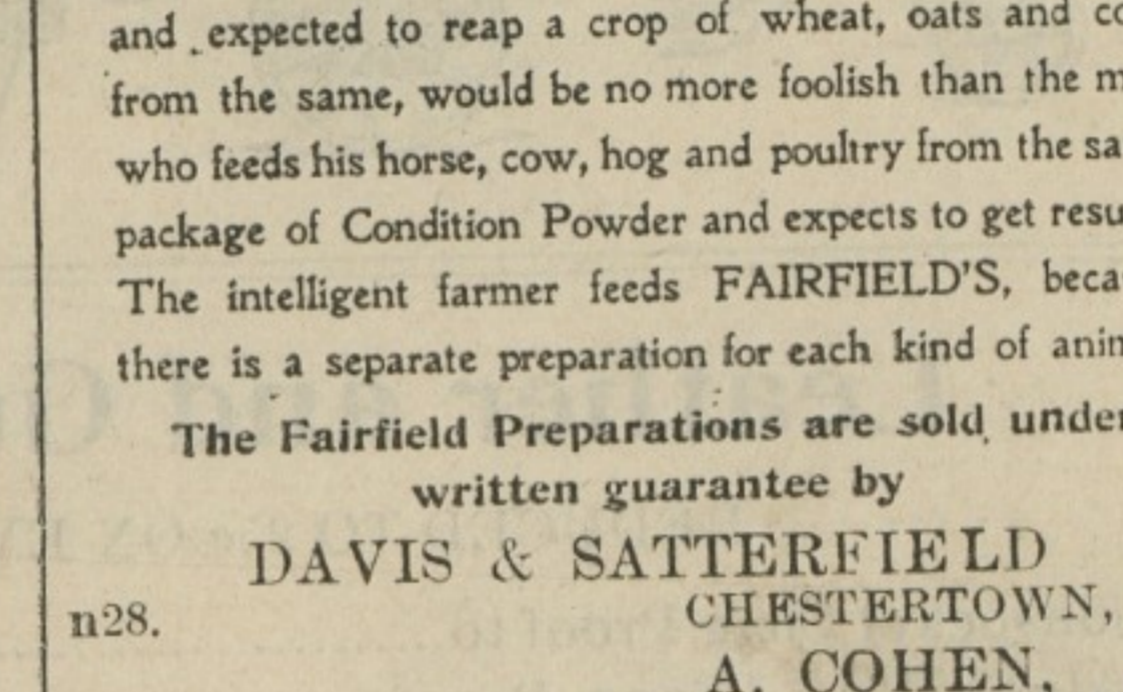

COURT IN SESSION.

Several Cases Marked Off—The Kelly Jury Disagree—Mr. Ireland Given a Verdict.

The adjourned session of the Circuit Court for Kent county convened at Chestertown Tuesday, Judge W. H. Adkins on the bench. The first case called was that of J. Herman Ireland vs. Capt. Andrew W. Woodall—suit on note, Jury trial. Verdict for Mr. Ireland in full amount of claim, viz. \$1305.10. Messrs. H. H. Barroll and Lewin W. Wickes for plaintiff, Wm. W. Beck for defendant.

The case against John H. Kelley on charge of selling intoxicating drinks to James H. King, detective, proved an interesting case. The evidence all showed that for about ten years Mr. Kelley has been selling soft drinks including "orange soda." A bottle was opened before the jury and each given a "whiff." A number of witnesses testified to drinking this soda but did not feel it except the "putting up" sensation. The jury, after being out until 10 p. m., were discharged, the jury standing seven for acquittal and five for conviction. The case was carried over to April term—Marion DeK. Smith for defense; W. W. Beck for State.

Several other civil cases on the docket were either marked off or continued and the jury discharged.

The case against John Chambers for shooting Wm. Davis at a Chestertown picnic was tried before the Court Thursday morning. He was convicted and sentenced to 2 years in penitentiary. W. W. Beck for State; S. Scott Beck for defense. The evidence showed that several Delaware negroes were present at the picnic selling liquor. A crap game was a side issue and it was over the money lost in the game that the shooting took place. One of the witnesses said he was fined \$7.10 for simply looking at the game.

Court finally adjourned Thursday morning.
