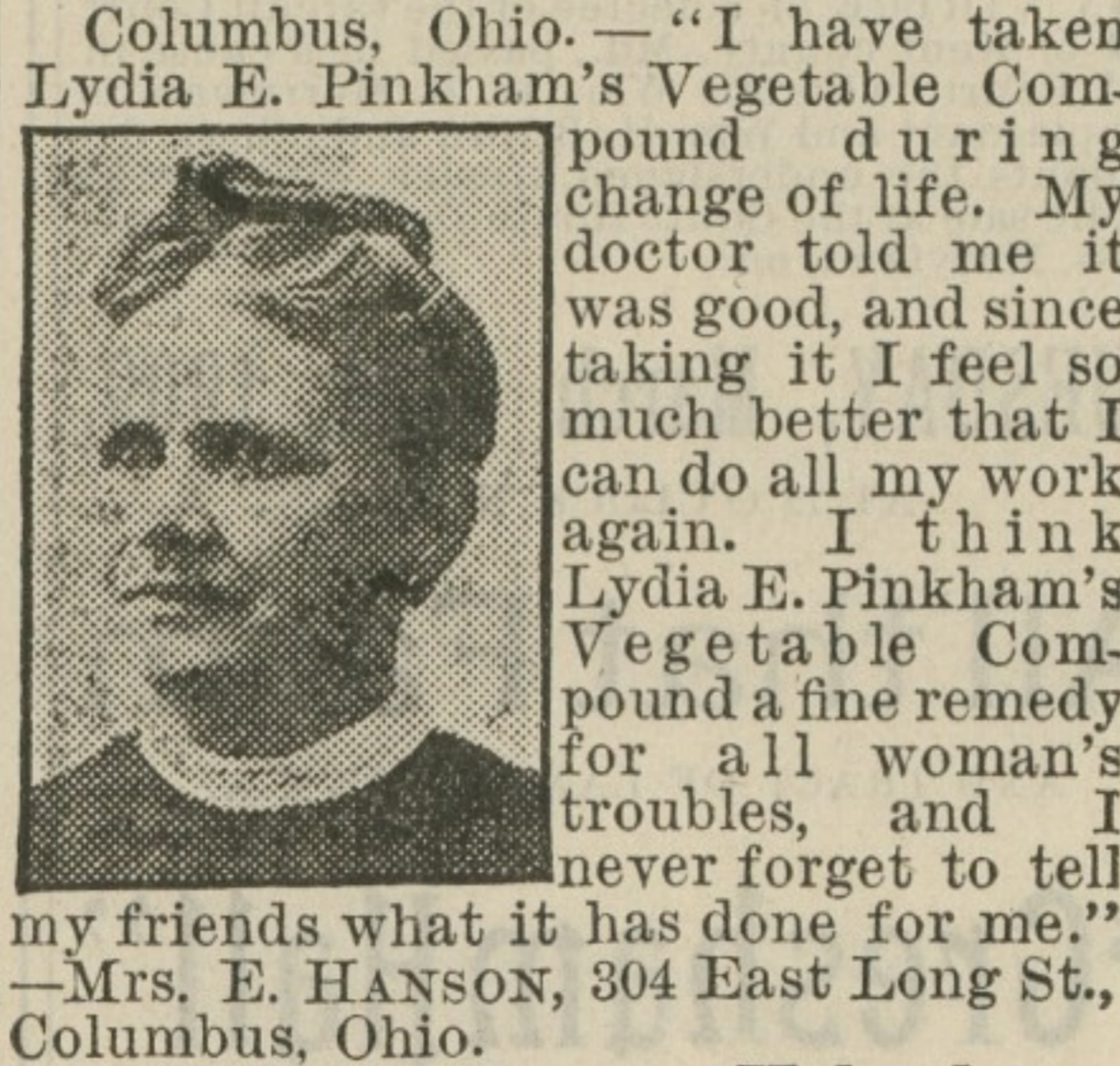

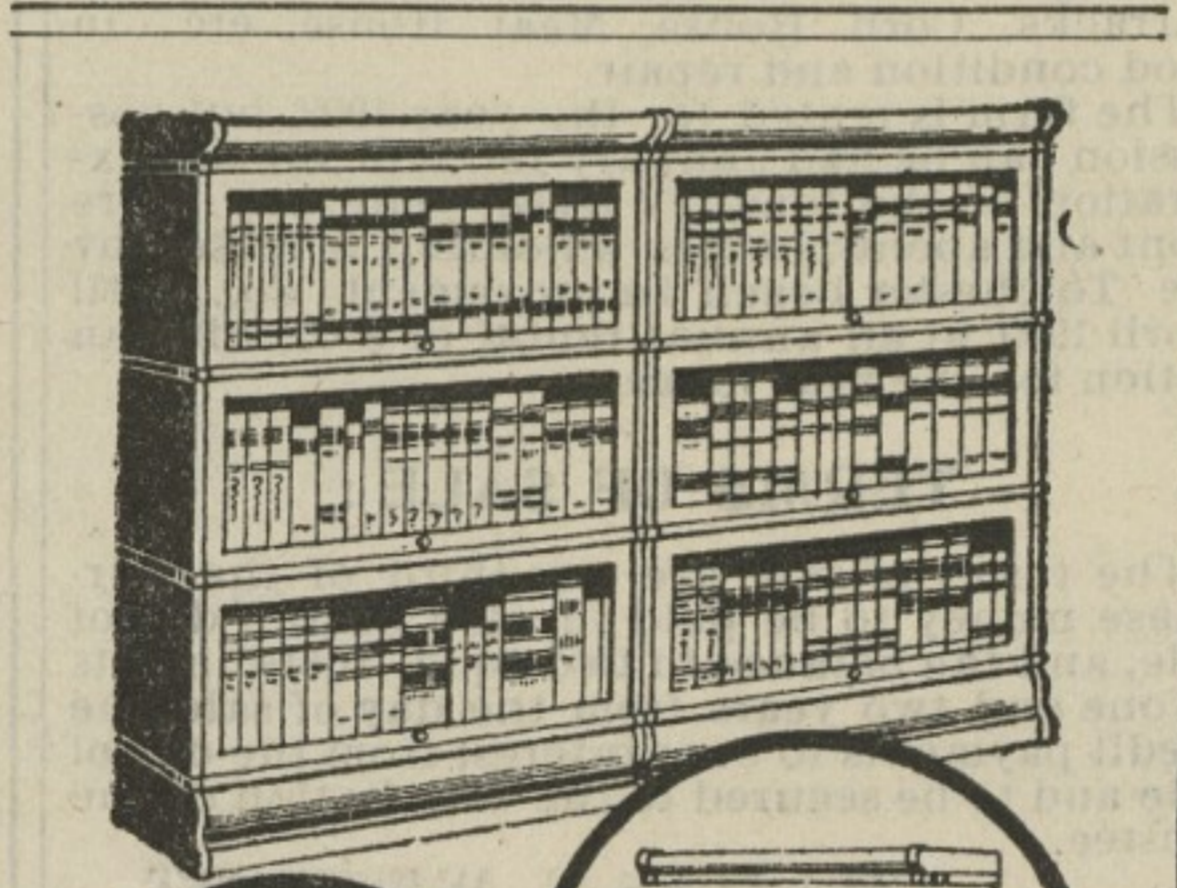

MINISTERIAL APPOINTMENTS

Will be Made at Methodist Protestant Conference Session.

The work of the eighty-first annual session of the Maryland Conference of the Methodist Protestant Church, which will be held in Baltimore at St. John's Church, St. Paul and Twenty-seventh streets, from April 7 to 14, will be preceded by a great temperance meeting to be held a day before the opening of the real session.

The first official meeting will be held on Wednesday morning, April 7. On Wednesday evening the service will be of a special character, and a prominent theologian from Massachusetts has been engaged to deliver the sermon. The annual Conference is also important from the fact that at this time the new appointments and changes affecting the ministers are made. The business of the Conference is presided over by the president, Rev. J. M. Sheridan, who also makes the appointments. The secretary is Rev. W. Sherman Phillips of Salisbury.

At the last session of the General Conference of the denomination, held in Pittsburg last May, the department of young people's work was added to the regular work of the church. This department embraces the Sabbath School and other societies of the denomination of the entire church. In order to make this advantage to the pastors of the church, Rev. C. H. Hubbell, D. D., of Ohio, was elected as general secretary and devotes his entire time to this department. Rev. G. W. Hadaway, of Starr Church, is president.

This will be the first time this department has been given a hearing at a Maryland Conference, and Thursday evening, April 8, has been set aside as young people's night. At this meeting Rev. Dr. Hubbell and General Secretary William Shaw, of the United Society of Christian Endeavor, Boston, Mass., will be the speakers. This promises to be one of the features of the gathering this year.

The secretary and treasurer of the Foreign Mission Board, Rev. F. C. Klein, lives in Baltimore and has his office at the Book Rooms, 316 N. Charles street. Rev. Mr. Klein was formerly a missionary and later was pastor of North Baltimore Church but at the last General Conference he was elected foreign secretary and had to give up his ministry and Rev. P. O. Grouse, D. D., was appointed to North Baltimore Church.

The Maryland Conference is rather extensive in the territory covered, as it has churches in New Jersey, Delaware and Pennsylvania, as well as Maryland and District of Columbia and Virginia.
