

BIG CANNING HOUSE IN EASTON BURNED

The large canning house of Chesapeake Canning Co., situated in the southern suburb of Easton, was destroyed by fire Friday afternoon, together with about 30 cases of tomatoes and 5,000 new tomato sets, which had been put in the building Thursday for use next season. Mr. Lee with one or two men were working in the factory at the time the fire. One of them went outside and saw the main building in flames. An alarm was sent in, but when the fire company arrived the factory was doomed, and attention was turned to saving the surrounding buildings. The canning was one of the largest on the Eastern Shore and was equipped with modern machinery for packing tomatoes and corn. Origin of fire is unknown. The loss will be between \$40,000 and \$45,000. Mr. Lee's loss will exceed his insurance by over \$25,000.

BIG LIFE INSURANCE

Pierre S. du Pont, the head of the powder company in Wilmington, is among the highest insured men in the United States. He is third, by carrying an insurance policy for \$4,000,000, says an article on "prominent patrons of life insurance," published by the Spectator Publishing Company, of New York.

The leader of this group is Adolph Zuker the motion picture magnate, who carries a policy for \$5,000,000. Rodman Wanamaker, of Philadelphia is second with four and a half million. The Gimble Brothers, of Philadelphia, are insured collectively for \$1,500,000. Various moving picture stars also carry enormous amounts. 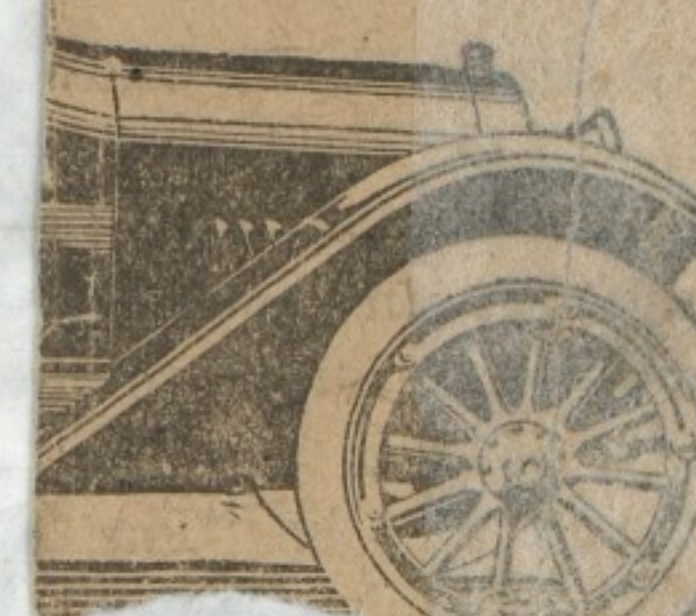
