The number received during the year was 97. Of this number 86 were males and 11 females-62 whites and 35 blacks -74 Americans and 23 foreigners, viz :-97,604 90 15 natives of Germany, 1 of Turkey, 1 of Prussia, 1 of Russia, 4 of Ireland and 1 of 80,428 S1 France. Of the whole number,—97,—32 were convicted in the courts of this city.
