NOTICE is hereby given to the Judges of Elections and to the voters of Queen Anne's County that an Election will be held in the several election districts of Queen Anne's County...

AN ACT.

To add a new Article to the Code of Public Local Laws for St. Mary's, Calvert, Howard, Kent, Baltimore, Worcester, Somerset, Talbot, Queen Anne's, Prince George's and Charles Counties...

SECTION I. And be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the County Commissioners of St. Mary's, Calvert, Howard, Kent and Baltimore Counties, be and they are hereby authorized to appoint...

SECTION II. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the said Board of Commissioners to assemble at the usual places of holding elections in their respective districts...

SECTION III. And be it enacted, That the said Board of Commissioners, shall, under their hands and seals, issue summons to be directed to one or more constables...

SECTION IV. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the said Board of Commissioners to hire, as they may think proper, by hiring themselves to some industries and respectable citizen...

SECTION V. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the said Board of Commissioners to have said free negroes so summoned to attend at the time and place in common...

SECTION VI. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the said Board of Commissioners to indenture to some citizen of the said counties all free negroes from four to twelve years of age...

SECTION VII. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the said Board of Commissioners to bind out the said issues in the manner and for the period specified in the foregoing section...

SECTION VIII. And be it enacted, That the said Board of Commissioners shall allow such salaries and such auctioneers as may be called in for the purpose of conducting the sale of this act...
