

Senate January Session 1862

4 The Senate met 1 Jan 1862 and adjourned until 2 January when a quorum was present.

5. Mr Eichelberger submitted a preamble and joint resolution requesting James Alfred Pearce and Anthony Kennedy to resign as U.S. Senators since their election took place before the war began, and are not responsive to the majority of the State. 25 Jan. 1862.

6. The report of the committee on Fed. Relations to which the memorial of Hon A.A. Lynch was referred, report that they communicated with the State Dept. in Washington and received a reply that certain steps have been taken for his release. 27 Jan 1862.

On Feb 8, 1862 a note in the journal states that Mr Lynch of Baltimore Co is detained from his seat in the Senate by indisposition in his family. Mr Lynch was present February 12, 1862.

On 10 March correspondence concerning Mr Lynch's imprisonment and release was published. (pg 517-518)
