

4. A committee on the Militia was formed in 1824. It might be interesting to check this one out.
5. Usually committees beginning "An Act..." were not included. If one had a special subject to pursue, that might be interesting.
6. After a certain year there would be ^{special} committees appointed to examine various aspects of the Governor's message or more usually, an assignment was given to a standing committee on a subject. It included these special committees if the Speaker made a point of it.

VIII Should opponents to Senators be listed? For many years the Senate did not nominate anyone so the election was unopposed.

Should those appointed to count the ballots be noted? (This can be picked up in Senate Journal).

B. List of clerk + assistant clerk.
Also many committee clerks were elected every year. door keepers, Sargent at arms, Lamp lighters. Should they be included? they were not.

C. Very few special Commissions. none in later years. Or was name changed? see controversy Senate note 1802; 1860's ^{and Senate} ambassadors to foreign states.

Indices to House Journals are uneven. One could not count on finding the standing committee listed or the legislators listed.
