<sup>2</sup> When the Committee of Elections and Privileges reported the names of those duly returned as members of the House of Delegates on November 7, 1793, no return had been received for Caroline County. The Committee announced on November 11, 1793, the names of the Caroline County delegates.

<sup>3</sup> Also spelled Clarke in the proceedings for November 6, 1793.

<sup>4</sup> Montgomery requested to be excused from acting on the Committee of Grievances and Courts of Justice. Waggaman was added to the committee in place of Montgomery on December 2, 1793.

<sup>5</sup> John Kelly, <sup>having</sup> declined to accept appointment to Governor's Council November 23, 1793. was appointed clerk of the Council and qualified as such.

<sup>6</sup> Christopher Richmond was elected to council in room of John Kelly, who declined Nov. 23, 1793. On Oct 6, 1794 doubts having arisen whether the seat of Christopher Richmond was not vacated by his acting as Deputy Collector of the Customs at the Port of Baltimore under Gen. Otho N. Williams. The board were of the opinion that the seat was vacated, and a new election held. Richmond was reelected, <sup>same day</sup> and qualified October 24, 1794. (p 60 Proceedings of the Council).

<sup>7</sup> The Governor reelected, and Council elected on the same day. The council met November 23 1794.
