- ¹ Adjourned until November 3, 1795 when a sufficient number were present.
- ² When the Committee of Elections and Privileges reported the names of those duly returned as members of the House of Delegates on November 5, 1795, no return had been received for Frederick County. The Committee announced on November 10, 1795 the names of the delegates duly elected and returned.
- ³ The House unanimously assented to a motion made on December 2, 1795 urging the governor of Pennsylvania either to grant John Montgomery a noli prosequi or to withdraw the demand for Montgomery's arrest and surrender.
- ⁴ On December 24, 1795 the House resolved unanimously "That the thanks of this house be presented to Philip Key, Esquire, in testimony of their approbation of his conduct in the chair, and of the ability, impartiality and attention, manifested in the various duties assigned him as speaker of this house."
- ⁵ It is not clear whether the Key named to these committees was Philip Key of St. Mary's County or Philip Barton Key of Annapolis.
- ⁶ The Council met November 13, 1795.
