⁷ John H. Thomas was elected speaker pro tem on January 16, 1815, to replace Chapman who was absent. Chapman returned as speaker on January 21, 1815.

⁸ On February 2, 1815, the House resolved "That the thanks of this house be presented to their speaker the honorable Henry H. Chapman, for his faithful and dignified discharge of the duties of the chair during the present session."
