

Saturday 5 May 1810

At 2 p.m. all hands got on board the Ship's
Long Boat at the Quay and proceeded to the
Ship at Ganap, in the Evening the Capt. went
on board.

Sunday 6 May 1810

At Meridian the Mastie came on board, and at
1 p.m. got underway with the wind at N.E
beating down the Longs, at 9 p.m. about 7
Cauichygen wind very moderate

Monday 7 May 1810

Fresh Breezes from E to S.E. all sails
set, at 8 p.m. lost sight of the Irish Land
and Tory Island from whence Capt. Baker
took his departure

Tuesday 8

Strong Gale from S.E. to E.S.E. with a
heavy following Sea that caused the
Ship to labour much most of the Day
and some slight rains in the afternoon

Wednesday 9

A moderate but steady Breeze Wind mostly
E.S.E. came West, towards evening some slight
squalls, papers & letters all hands turned
up on Deck & between Decks & letters
washed out. 153.59
