On the receipt of your favour of 25<sup>th</sup> May, I immediately  
Applied to the Register ~~Office~~ of the Land Office for the Documents  
wanted to establish your title to that part of Munnymede enlarged  
to which Mr. Medley claims as his right, & do now send you  
inclosed with this, full Copies of the Survey on Prop<sup>r</sup> Kings  
and of Munnymede enlarged, which are the only papers that  
I apprehend you will necessarily want from that Office.  
By the Lines, of the Survey of Prop<sup>r</sup> Kings, the Land inclosed  
is actually included in that Survey, if they are run according  
to the Calls or references to the neighbouring Tracts therein express'd  
unfortunately however it was found that the Course & Distance  
did not correspond with these references — by the Lines in question  
is actually within the Lines of Prop<sup>r</sup> Kings, if they are run  
according to the references to adjoining Tracts as called for  
in the Survey, & the property thereof is confirmed to S. Prop<sup>r</sup>  
as appears by the inclosed Copy of the Patent granted him — 1752. ~~When  
this property became a mine, I learned that the Survey had been  
made by him, that was incomplete to some of the Tracts, & full of  
Errors, & was taken out by his Executors in the City of the  
inclosed Munnymede enlarged you will find my right to this  
Land confirmed, & also such a clear Description of the various  
References made, not only in Prop<sup>r</sup> Kings, but on that Occasion  
by planting a great Number of Stones, where they were desired in 1752, & so on.  
When they are not removed, they will long demonstrate the Bounds of  
this Tract. This Survey was made with great care & attention by a very  
learn'd man & correct Surveyor, & the Stones placed & marked  
with the Approbation of the parties concerned, at the place call'd  
for in Munnymede. This was a real & lasting Benefit to all the~~
