Baltimore Saturday

I received your letter this morning but I do not know who brought it. I intended to have written before, only I expected my Father here daily, I wish he had all his flour here at present it is \$13 out of the waggon. Last night I was at Dr. Whitts they are all well, I had the pleasure of seeing Mrs Williams & her Husband betwixt her & him there is a very great contrast, Joseph soon takes up house the Boys are arrived in New York and are expected here in a few Days, I suppose they will have letters for our family. I saw Miss Betsy the night before she went. Mr. Allen is left the College I believe it was in consequence of the Boys beating him as one of them did one day with a broom stick. Mr. Little behaves very well as yet as he has not taken any thing to show scarcely as yet. I have heard of Mr. Thomsons sudden motion, as I never was in Frederic town I must try & get up when I come up at Christmas to see finally Miss Fanny give my love to my Mother, Uncle & the family I suppose I need not write again until by my Father.
