without much Inconvenience - There is
a Brewery in this Town which Jas Scanlan &

I was looking at but the owner wishes to
sell rather than let he wants £1300 for it
of course it is beyond our means, there is a
Gentleman here however who I understand
is willing to purchase it to accommodate us
on receiving Interest for his Money, indeed
the kindness we have experienced here is
scarcely to be describ'd, provided I could
procure the Sum mentioned in my last
Letter to put in with the same Sum of
Jas Scanlan's it would be a
sufficient Capital to carry
it on & I think we could

maintain our Families comfortably by it
In the mean Time (until that was arranged) if
I had it I would vest it in Lumber which is
as sure a Trade nearly as Jimmy Kilbuck used
to be in Rosemary Lane - You will find few
split Ends in the board I will send you, those
that are cut up the River & come down in Rafts
have a good deal it is then I propose buying
if I had the means I have it entirely separate
from the Mill Business, the \$500 I put in
