Your favor 25th Inst^l came duly to
Hand, we did not think you could get home that
early, as the train came on here at 11 O'clock from Wey
It had the worst of it. I shall call on Mr. Scherer and
get the Clover Seed of the best sort and as cheap as possi-
-ble. I have no doubt of getting you Six Dollars of
Barrel for Flour which will answer you much better
to send it here than to Baltimore. The Waggan has
-ing to come for Plaster - at same time and some
Mutton which I have no doubt will sell well,
If you can send some Dcutty & Butter. This is
a good market for such. Tell Charles to inquire
at the Havens between this and your Town
what Ole may be wanting. I shall send
Letter to Mr. Robinson - Sally will write by
to Mrs B. as I told you already. Really think
Wpton is not making any progress at School
and I recommend it to you to take him home
for the ensuing Quarter & see what can be done
with him. The weather is now so cold that there
is little of his time spent at School - & should
you wish to send him back in Summer we
will always be happy in receiving any of your
Family - In writing the above I saw Mr. Arbuckle
he has been offered \$200 for the Horse by a near neigh-
-bour he says. But if you wish to have him, say
so immediately as he is leaving this Town shortly.

No other sud yet come to Mr A. - as soon as it
does you may depend on getting it - The Family all here
