York 19th April 1815

Since writing the accompanying Letter
I have seen Mr Cathcart, Cap^t Geddes's letter to him
said they ^{Quicks} would be taken up & forwarded as soon
as the frost would permit, & Mr C. desired them to be
forwarded by the safest & most expeditious way to the care
of Harris & Donaldson B. more, he will write this day
respecting them. - The Bill was endorsed by
Mr Robinson & handed over to Mr C. - agreeable to
order, the money will be got for it in a day or
two, I will write to Mr Kline for an acc^t of the
Plaster, do you know how much has been got.
Schriener's acc^t of the Crown Laid I think is not
correct, the second parcel that was got I believe
was not paid for, I know you paid for the first.
The Shad fishing has just commenced on your
supplies from this Quarter on B. more side,
the fish is reckoned better here, it seems the
farther up the River the better. -
