Yark 16 June 1815

We rec^d your kind favor
yesterday also the Flour - We send Terence
I hope he may arrive safe, but the weather
is almost too warm to be sure of it. —
We bought a crate which will be the
best thing to send him in as he will get
whatever Air is going - We could not
send so much water as you wished, as
we had not Bottles to spare, Orders coming
in from all quarters for it, I wonder
Mr Shrobb did not send his^{own} Bottles when so
good an opportunity offered, if he does by
any one going to the River we will fill
& return them by the same person, or if he
thinks it an object we could send it to
Hanover, when we send there, — These Bottles
are Glass & belong to another person, we had
not one Dozen of Stone ^{Bottles} in the House, We
hope to get an Additional supply in a
few days we only want that to send it
away as fast as we could fill it. —
All here are well —
