28th July 1815

I rec^d your esteemed favours from B. more & note their Contents, what you say I have no doubt is right, the only difficulty will be to get Mrs G. to write - Jas McElroy is a very good hand on those Occasions, She & I were always on good Terms, a good opportunity now occurs for writing as you will see by the enclosed Letter. Any letters you have if sent here, we will forward them with our own - I was present at an Examination in the Academy to day, Mr Cathcart said the higher Classes (to which Worthy belongs) acquitted themselves very well, Worthy says his Quarter will come up & that you had some Idea of sending him to B. more as soon as a good situation offered, I told him I would mention the Circumstance to you. —

I feel very sorry for poor Jas Whittle, to think that his Brother Frank was living like a Nabob at Castle Upton. He can't get Security for his offer of 10s. in the pound, could I have viewed my Brother's affairs with that Indifference I might have been in Belfast yet.
