Library not having yet received any appointment.
My son William who has taken his degree as a
Surgeon from Edinburgh is yet at home. Do
you conceive that he could do any good for old
age in America? My other two Sons are also
with me as Farmers, and I must look out for
residences for them and myself as I am to be
no longer an Inhabitant of Rockhill.

The young Man John Ha-
-mills who bears this has been bred to hard in-
-dustry, his parents are poor means in poor
circumstances. His views in going out are to
look for a Settlement in Land, but he is not
in great haste to establish himself. Should he
send this to you and should you have occasion
for a Superintendent in your Farming he might
prove a useful Man in your establishment. His

ancestors you may have heard of. They were the
Hamills near the Kings Moss, there whom there
could be no honest Men.
