

25th June 1841

My dear father

I had determined on tomorrow to visit you but to day our party was taken unexpectedly ^{we} & obliged to go to a friends fearing consequences I do not like to leave them all alone for two nights I find I mine is quite irregular in passing this here so that I don't know when to write Mr J. Key passed thro here this evg I presume he has heard of his ejection. As to the boy I know not what to say (he writes p.p. p.d. in) he says C ought neither to take much exercise nor be confined too closely that his cough is a very ugly one though but unless he saw him under actual disease he could not say much about, but it might be that there is some irritability about his heart judging by his pulse Mr Worthington will be on soon perhaps this month & I tho' as it would be highly gratifying for her to see us all together that it would be better for them not to go up until she has been here as it would be
