Inductions to be observed by Royal Comandante  
 of the ship Rainbow's crew of Peace on board  
 of the said Ship

1. You are to take no board the said ship the French prisoners  
 in the said manner mentioned and not with the said for arms and  
 make the best of your way directly for ... and take care  
 having your passage that all the prisoners be well treated according  
 to their Rank

2. You are to take care that you do to receive my  
 Comandante for Exchange of prisoners like what is his Comandante  
 Comandante of the said Ship and Exchange of prisoners of  
 French Prisoners to the said British Subjects  
 and to make known to him that you have done the same  
 each prisoner be discharged to each British Subjects away  
 a Prisoner's free according to the Rank of my Comandante

3. You are to be put on my said prisoners as taken to be for the  
 Comandante on Ship that have appointed you what British  
 Subjects are to be given as prisoners of War and that  
 have agreed with you as to the Number of them to be exchanged  
 in Exchange pursuant to my said Comandante and if there shall  
 not be an equal Number of British Prisoners for Exchange for  
 French Prisoners you are to take what British Prisoners there  
 are, and report a Certificate upon the Governor or Comandante in

Chief setting forth that he hath received the Comandante's authority  
 you and what Number he wishes to Exchange

4. If there be any prisoners there lately taken in the said Ship you  
 are to mind that they be of the Number delivered to you in Exchange

5. When you have got the British prisoners on Board you are to  
 give a passport or safe conduct from the Governor or Comandante  
 to be put on you and the said Ship from being molested by  
 any Men of war privateers or Subjects of the said British Kingdom  
 in any of his other

6. You are to take care not to give any part of any of the Subjects  
 of his most Christian Majesty or his allies nor carry any kind of  
 War like Stores or provisions except what is necessary for the  
 Subsistence of the said Ship and crew

7. You are not to carry more than two pieces of Cannon nor fire any  
 Guns unless as a signal of fire or shot

8. You are to make English Colors with a white fringe and my  
 Comandante's that if you be seen

9. If you are to bring to the said Ship that their Comandante  
 having your paper (which are my Comandante's) and is to make  
 my Comandante upon my said

 the said paper the Day of June 1759
