

Maryland 27th August 1767.

Gentlemen

We being appointed by his Excellency our Governor, Commissioners for executing a Law of this Province passed in November last, Entituled An Act for the Payment of the Public Claims for emitting Bills of Credit and for other purposes therein mentioned & as also another Act passed at the same time for the purchasing of Stationary &c Both which Acts we herewith inclose you for your perusal being the two last passed in the Session.

We have now to acknowledge the receipt of your ^{late} favor directed to the Commissioners Viz. of Sept. 9th May 6 and 21st covering James Hunters Protest and the Province Account to the 28th of May, as also acquainting of the Death of Mr. William Hunt one of the Trustees which we have communicated to the Governor and as the Assembly are to meet the 5th October next, your several Letters and Account we shall then lay before the Committee that will be appointed for their Examination.

In consequence of the last Act above mentioned you have here remitted James Hunters Bill on Messrs Jordan and Maxwell for £207. 19s 6 which on Payment you will find by the said Act is to be invested in Capital Stocks for the use of this Province. The Bill drawn in 1764 to William Worthington we are informed is still in their Possession, the other small one to J. Brine is no doubt with you by this time.
