Whereupon the said John by William Bladen his attorney complains
 that whereas the said William wrote the said Count of Tyndal
 in the year of our Lord God 1706 at Baltimore hundred in the County of
 did deliver unto the said John the houses and premises and together
 with the appurtenances called as aforesaid St. Martin or the Manor the
 said Robert and the said Count of Tyndal containing lying and being
 as aforesaid to have and to hold the same with the appurtenances unto
 the said John from the said Fourth Day of September 1706 until the
 full end and Term of five years fully to be completed and ended by
 Virtue whereof the said John into the said Count of Tyndal and a warrant
 and did enter and was there of possessed and being so thereof possessed the
 said Robert afterwards to wit the said Fourth Day of September 1706 at Baltimore
 hundred in the County of Somerset with force and arms did enter into
 the said Count of Tyndal and appurtenances in form as demanded for
 the term as yet to come and did upon the possession of the
 the said John enter and him from his farm and did expect and other
 harm to him did to his great Damage and against the Peace of the Queen
 the said John sayeth he is Damified and has Lost to his Value of one
 hundred pounds Ster. and thereupon he bringeth this Suit
