summed to required to do so he left the said John at his
own there to required by reasonable Dues of the said
William Finch hath not rendered but the same to him
to render hath demurred still do denye Whereupon
he saith he is damaged and has lost to the Value of
One hundred pounds and that thereupon he brings this
Bill in Law To wit John Dier
